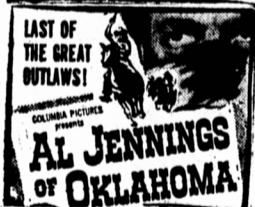

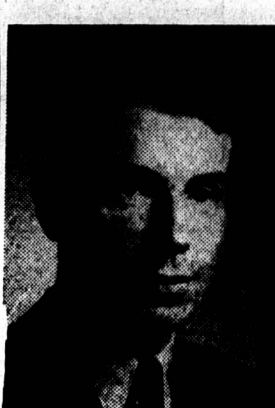

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How Clark Gable Does It To Please His Lady In New Exciting Movie Hit
