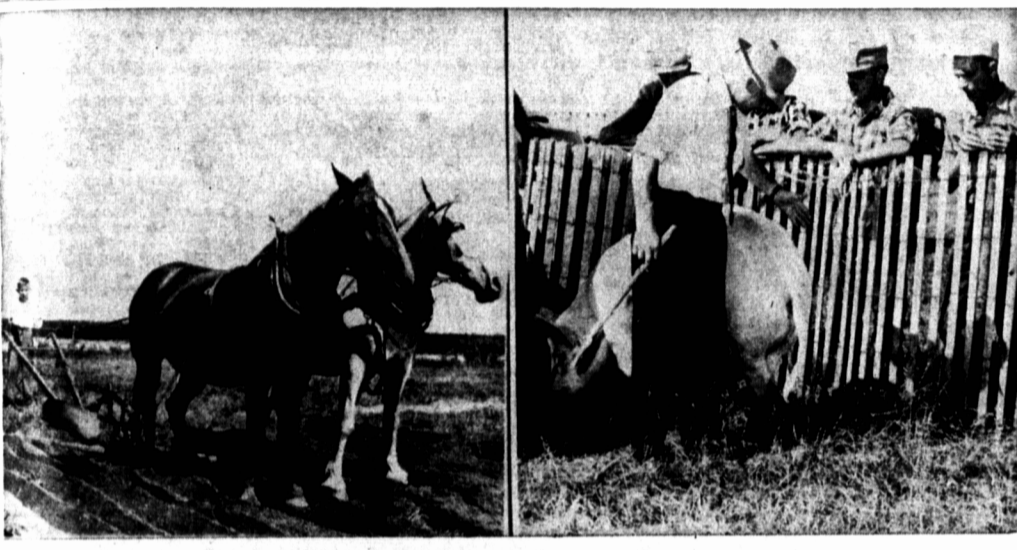

Departure ceremonies were conducted recently at St. Finian's Cathedral, Alexandria, Ontario, by Most Reverend Rosario Brodeur, Bishop of Alexandria, for five members of Our Ladies Missionaries, Immaculate House, Alexandria who left on July 30 for Okene in the Province of Kabba, South West Nigeria, British West Africa.  
The five missionaries, all registered nurses, sailed from Montreal on the Empress of Britain for Liverpool, England, and continued from Liverpool on August 17th, to Lagos, Nigeria. They will conduct a government hospital at their destination of Okene.  
Many members of the clergy of the diocese and any friends and relatives were among the large congregation which attended the ceremonies and heard the Bishop command the five nurses and instruct them prior to their departure. Each sister was presented with her missionary cross during the ceremonies.

**HONEY BUN RING**  
Scald 1/4 c. milk, 1/2 c. granulated sugar, 1 1/2 tps. salt and 1/4 c. shortening; cool to lukewarm. Measure into a large bowl 1/2 c. lukewarm water; crumble and add 1 cake Best Yeast—or stir in 1 tsp. granulated sugar and sprinkle with 1 envelope Best dry Yeast. Let stand 10 minutes, THEN stir well. Add cooled milk mixture and stir in 1 well-beaten egg and 1 tsp. grated lemon rind. Stir in 2 c. once-sifted all-purpose flour; beat until smooth. Work in 2 c. (about) once-sifted all-purpose flour. Knead on lightly-floured board until smooth and elastic.

Place in greased bowl and grease top of dough. Cover and set in warm place, free from draft. Let rise until doubled in bulk. Punch down dough and roll out into an oblong about 9" wide and 24" long; loosen dough. Combine 1/2 c. lightly-packed brown sugar and 1/2 c. liquid honey; spread over dough and sprinkle with 1/4 c. broken walnuts. Beginning at a long side, loosely roll up like a jelly roll. Lift carefully into a greased 8 1/2" tube pan and join ends of dough to form a ring. Brush top with melted butter. Cover and let rise until doubled in bulk. Bake in moderately hot oven, 375°, 45-50 minutes. Brush top with honey and sprinkle with chopped walnuts.
