TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

(SPECIAL DESPATCHES TO THE EXAMINER.) The Eastern War Cloud. LONDON, Oct. 19. The situation in the East has again assumed a serious aspect, owing to the bellicose attitude of Serbia.

PRINCE ALEXANDER, after endeavoring to patch up an agreement with King Milan, telegraphed the latter that he intended sending Minister Grekoff to the Serbian Court on a special mission. King Milan declined to receive the mission. It is evident from his answer that Serbia is determined to fight for territorial aggrandizement.

SOPLA, Oct. 19. The relations between Bulgaria and Serbia are much strained. The refusal of King Milan to receive Minister Grekoff, who was to have been sent by Prince Alexander on a special mission to Serbia, indicates a speedy invasion of Bulgaria by Servians.

THE Bulgarians are exasperated by Sarvia's attitude, and a Cabinet Council will be held to-day to consider the situation.

NATIONALIST NOMINATIONS. DUBLIN, Oct. 19. The Nationalists of Cavan, at a crowded convention to-day, selected Joseph Biggar, M. P., and Thomas O'Hanlan as their candidates for the Commons. Lord Claremont has nominated 15 per cent. of the rents of tenants in Newry, owing to low prices which they obtain for their produce.

AQUATIC. ALBANY, Oct. 19. Arrangements for the single scull race between Hanlan and Teemer are in bad shape to-day. Hanlan called upon Teemer and endeavored to persuade him to withdraw his opposition and row on the 26th instead of the 24th, the day named in the agreement. His mission was unsuccessful, and it is said, the oarsmen parted with not the best feeling towards each other.

FOR THE NORTHWEST. TORONTO, Oct. 19. Major Wilson, Lieut. Benson and twenty-three men of A Battery left Kingston to-night for Winnipeg to relieve the men on duty at Battleford.

THE NEW ARCHBISHOP OF COLOGNE. BERLIN, Oct. 19. The Emperor William has issued a rescript, recognizing Archbishop Kremenetz, the Pope's appointee to the Archdiocese of Cologne.

THE EGYPTIAN GOVERNMENT. LONDON, Oct. 19. Sir Henry Drummond Wolfe, special British Envoy, and the Porte, have signed a protocol respecting the government of Egypt.

SMALLPOX AT RIVER DU LOUP. RIVIERE DU LOUP, Oct. 19. The bark Venics, Capt. Hill, arrived here from Montreal on Saturday with what the doctors pronounced a bad case of smallpox.

WHALING VESSEL WRECKED. LONDON, Oct. 19. The whaling vessel Alice Williams was wrecked on the coast of Iceland, on Sept. 10. Her crew have arrived at Granton.
