present the Extension Division, and it is the responsibility of the responsible to the community for the success of the club. Persons who act in this capacity have ideals and standards a good deal higher than those of the group believe in club work when they see what can be accomplished. It is important for a leader to be familiar with the aims of this youth movement. Leadership in this phase is only a relative term, and there is no standard for measuring its requirements. It is not expected that all the desirable qualities of a leader will be found in any one person when he accepts the leadership of a club. If one possesses a few of the essential qualities others will develop by being interested in the activities of the club.

DUTIES DIFFER

Now the question arises—what are leaders expected to do? Duties vary according to the type of club work, but they are all expected to assist the club members in their progress. The program of work is simply a statement of the objectives and aims of the club for the season. It provides for topics to be studied, demonstrations to be given, projects to be completed, meetings to be held, and judging to be done. The program must be realistic, because these are the very things that make our work so interesting and profitable. If a yearly program is drawn up and adopted, the problem of leadership will be much simpler. Leaders should be familiar with literature published by the Extension Division, and should keep the county representative and home office advised of their progress and activities of the club. A leader must have an interesting program to follow so that the members will remain in the club. The program should be simple. When a girl or boy remains only one or two years, there is no real benefit. The length of time is not so important as the quality of the work. It is easier for parents to observe desirable changes and attitudes than to see a girl or boy who has been in the club for a long time.

WHO CAN HELP

Who can help provide leadership in a community? Senior citizens, parents, and the Extension Division. We encourage and develop 4-H club work. The Extension Division is an organization that can help in helping boys and girls make useful lives. They can provide the privilege and experience which come through organized youth groups. Membership in these 4-H organizations is the preparation for the kind of men and women of tomorrow. The Extension Division is a part of the government, and its members are the Home and Community Development Societies. The combined efforts of the church, the school, and the home will certainly help in developing our youth.
