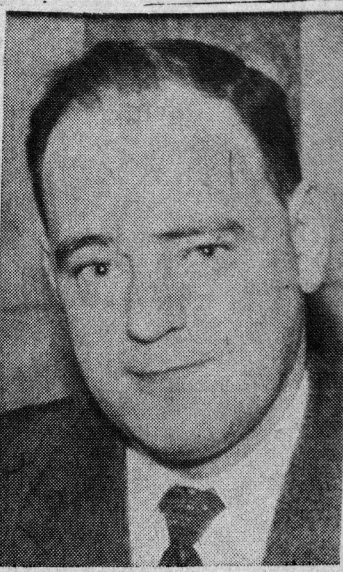


Murray Harbor C.G.I.T. Affiliates With The W.M.S.

Supports Small Universities Plan

TORONTO (CP) — C. Sydney Frost, president of the Bank of Nova Scotia, who is spearheading a 1,750,000 drive for the Acadia University Fund, said Thursday strengthening small, decentralized universities is the best method of meeting the challenge of higher education in Canada.

In a report issued to the press, Mr. Frost said university enrolment would "double" by 1965 and stressed that increased facilities will be needed "to accommodate this great increase."

"A network of well-placed, well organized, small universities and colleges will play a large role in determining the future success of Canada's higher education program," the general chairman of the Acadia University Fund said.

Mr. Frost, formerly of Argyle, N.S., said Acadia University needs additional classrooms, increased laboratory facilities and more teachers to meet the expected influx of students in the near future.

Canada Wants 12-Mile Zone For Fisheries Only

GENEVA (CP)—Canada Monday declared her support for the 12-mile territorial waters limit she has asked for exclusive fishery rights in a 12-mile zone along her coast.

George Drew, high commissioner to the United Kingdom, said the 67-nation conference on the law of the sea that the 12-mile fishery zone, such as Canada has claimed since 1927, would be "most satisfactory and most practical."

Drew said Canada is sympathetic to Latin American claims for exclusive fishing rights up to 200 miles off-coast but said approval by the conference is "most unlikely."

He urged Chile, Peru and Ecuador to accept the 12-mile limit.

Drew emphasized Canada's support for the existing three-mile limit on territorial rights and said to extend it would be setting the clock back 300 years.

Proposals by Russia and several other countries that coastal states should be granted the right to fix their own sea border up to a maximum of 12 miles according to their own interests "would lead to anarchy."

Ontario has the largest number of candidates—261 for its 85 seats—but Quebec, traditionally a political hotbed, has the largest entry in any one riding. Montreal St. Henri and Montreal St. Jacques both have six candidates in the field and several other Montreal ridings have five contestants.
