Mexico Wins First Tuna Tournery Championship

By Kingsley Brown, Jr. (Canadian Press Staff Writer) WEDNESDAY, N. S. (CP)—Dr. Rodolfo Araya's 723-pound catch won Mexico its first championship of the International Tuna Tournament Saturday. In one of the most thrilling climaxes of the tournament's 16-year history, the tiny Mexico city obstetrician who had never caught a tuna in his life, hooked the whopper as the fog lifted on nearby Lobster Bay. He land it in an hour and 45 minutes. It was the biggest of the four fish caught during the three-day tournament that was spoiled when hurricane Carol scattered the tuna. It was the smallest number ever caught in the matches. Three tuna were caught Saturday. Argentina had held the lead since Thursday on the strength of a 158-pounder landed by Pablo Bardina. Argentina, Cuba and The Netherlands placed after Mexico in that order and none of the other six teams landed a fish. Venezuela's Julio de las Casas lost a big one after a five-minute struggle. The standing: Mexico, 1,239 points; Argentina 608; Cuba 501; The Netherlands 490. Scoreless were the United States, the British Commonwealth, Brazil, France, Venezuela and Chile. Cuba has won three times and Chile once. Scoring is based on poundage, with bonuses for the biggest and most fish of the day and the match. The tournament was saved for the second consecutive year by the alternate fishing hole at Lobster Bay, discovered last year when fishing was not good on Soldier's Rip, which in good weather is the world's best tuna fishing ground. After a storm the best spot is the bay, where all four fish were caught.
