### Nicklaus Captures Chi' Ship

LAS VEGAS, Nev. (AP)—Golfer Jack Nicklaus, whose big game suffered a near collapse on the back nine holes, hung on Sunday and won the \$85,000 Tournament of Champions for the second straight year.

Nicklaus held a spectacular lead from the edge of the green on the final hole for a one-over-par 73 and a 72-hole total of 279. He went to the 11th hole with a one-stroke margin over Al Geiberger and Doug Sanders, a hefty five-stroke lead at one point having melted to a tie with Geiberger.

Nicklaus abruptly cashed in on the \$12,000 winner's prize with a birdie putt.

Geiberger, with a 69, and Sanders, with a 66, tied for second at 281.

Deadlocked at 282 were U.S. Open champion Julius Boros, and Marcell Johnson School's Tommy Jacobs and Don Harney.

Arnold Palmer with his second straight 70, finished at 282.
