

Favored Hi Jay Wins Feature Trot-Pace Ch'ship

Favored Hi Jay grabbed the major share of the \$1,200 purse in the Evening Patriot Island owned trotting and pacing championships at the Charlottetown Driving Park last evening.

The Bill Boyles - owned Hi Jay, with regular driver Buddy Campbell handling the reins swept both dashes of the feature in times of 2:08 and 2:06.3. Second both trips was Stanley Mayhew's Sentinella going with Clarke Smith in the stulky Jack Brown driver Tammany Hall to third place finishes on both outings.

Rain forced cancellation of the eighth and final dash.

There was one other double dash winner on the card, Jolly Frisco, a bay gelding owned by Leith Clarke of Summerside, captured both ends of a C and D trot and pace.

Clarke Smith reined Jolly Frisco to a new lifetime mark of 2:12.1 in the first trip, lowering his tab by more than two seconds. His mark going into the race was 2:14.4. The gelding's second mile was in 2:13.4.

Clarke also drove the four-year-old gelding Future Chief to a new mark of 2:14.3 in the first dash of the night, also a C and D trot and pace event.

Cyclone Kelly captured the second dash of this event.

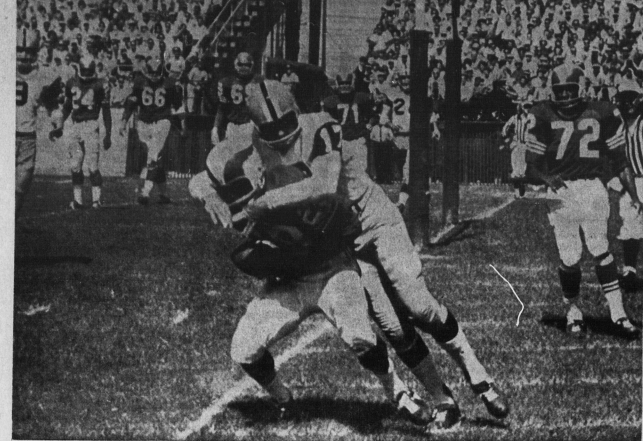
The other winner on the card was Ray Gratton U.S.

The biggest pay of the night was the quinnella on the fourth dash which paid \$27.70 on a combination of Ray Gratton U.S. and Jennie Brewer. The first double paid \$22.60 and the second \$4.30.

Right now, manager Walter Alton maintains that Sandy is through for the season. A hand nerve forced him out of action on July 17, just when he was having the greatest success of his young career. Since then the Dodgers have been going along with a seven-man pitching staff, the smallest in the major leagues.

That great relief artist, Larry Sherry, is also out and no word is mentioned when he will return. Larry has a sore arm and an injured ankle.

Regarding Koufax, Alton has this to say: "We feel Koufax is through for the season. His index finger isn't much better than it was a month ago. Even if the infection from a blister cleared and the nerve back disappeared within a couple of weeks, Sandy has been out for so long that he couldn't possibly return to form and be of help to us the balance of the season."

When Koufax was sidelined he was leading the league with an earned run average of 2.15 and had fanned 209 batters. The last time he pitched three shutouts were still tops. He had two shutouts, one of which was a no-hitter.

It's tough to lose anybody when you're engaged in pennant battles but to see a guy like Koufax disappear is something really disastrous.

Despite these setbacks, the Dodgers are still hanging in there and there's a good chance that they are yet in the National League with Sandy Koufax looking on.

Two Drivers Are Suspended

SAINT JOHN, N.B. (CP) — Judges at nearby Exhibition Park Raceway here handed out two suspensions, as a result of chemical tests on two racers that participated in harness racing cards at the Raceway.

Driver - owner Len Queen of Coldbrook, N.B. was suspended for 90 days after a test revealed that the horse Bolo Volo had been administered a drug. The test was made after the pacer won the first race Aug. 25. The suspension bars Queen from all activities in racing starting Sept. 1. Bolo Volo was suspended as well.

The second suspension by the judges was tagged on F. C. Perkins, owner of Son Elgin Perkins, who was set down for 14 days. Tests on the horse showed a trace of nicotine.

Perkins' suspension also came into effect on Sept. 1. Neither judges nor officials would say what drug Bolo Volo consumed. An Exhibition Park spokesman said saliva tests are performed on all heat winners. Spot tests are also performed.

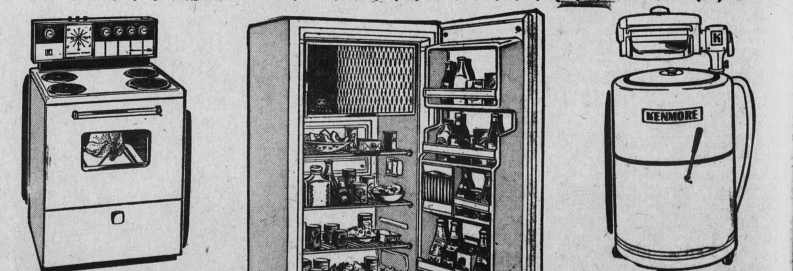
