ing in about five pages. Take care there are no medical blunders in his death. Then when the author comes back to dress for dinner, "The Archbishop is dead on my table; medicine, topography, theology all right, and Jones has gone home to his family some hours." Marquet was unquestionably considerable more than a mere delfer for facts or an amanuensis. His thorough knowledge of ancient France, its customs and its medieval defences was of especial value in writing: "The Three Musketeers." He may have written some chapters of this book and of the cloak and sword romances which followed it, but he did not create or give life to the three famous characters, Porthos, Athos and Aramis, in which the world has so greatly delighted.

PRIZE ESSAY

The Confederation Conference at Charlottetown in 1864, With its Developments

The following essay by Miss Dorothy McKenna received the prize of \$5.00 presented by the Daughters of the Empire at Notre Dame Academy this year as the best Essay on "The Confederation Conference at Charlottetown, 1864, and its development.

Many causes combined to make the Confederation of the British American Provinces, in 1867, possible and desirable. The Government of the United Provinces of Canada had become a structure based on shifting sand. By 1864, owing largely to racial and religious rivalries of the people, no Government could obtain a working majority. Projects for material development, plans for strengthening the country against foreign aggression, proposals for obtaining a renewal of the Reciprocity Treaty with the States, became little more than the shuttle cocks of faction.

It was natural, under this internal and external pressure that first the public men and then the public itself should begin to seriously discuss Confederation. John A. MacDonald, from an early period of his political life, and notably at Montreal in 1851, had seen the great possibilities which it involved.

The first really practical steps were taken in 1857 when the Nova Scotia Government under the leadership of Tupper and Johnson pressed the matter upon the consideration of the Imperial Ministry.

One June 30, 1864, a meeting was brought about by Alexander Morris, between the two rival Canadian leaders, John A. MacDonald and George Brown. A coalition Government was formed with the object and aim of confederating the Provinces of British America.

Meantime the Maritime Provinces had been considering the subject of union in a general way, though not as a relief from partisanship and disquiet. The proposition which

October 10, 1864 from all the Provinces of British America. Out of the Resolutions which practically constituted the British North America Act of 1867.

Prince Edward Island and Newfoundland refused to come into the Union, while British Columbia and the North West were not yet in a sufficiently organized and populated state to deal with the question. The final details were settled, and the Resolution, after passing through the Imperial Parliament as the British North America Act, received the Queen's Assent and became the constitution of the new Dominion of Canada on the ensuing first of July.

Following this union of the four older Provinces of British America under the common name of Canada came the period of continuous territorial expansion. The vast portions of the Hudson's Bay Company were purchased by the Dominion in 1869 and on July 5, 1870 a portion of that country entered Con-

ederation as the Province of Manitoba—after passing through the storms of the Red River Rebellion. On July 20, 1871, British Columbia followed the example thus given. Prince Edward Island, after protesting that it would never consent finally came into the Union on July 1st, 1873 partly from a desire to have its land question settled. In 1905 two other provinces Alberta and Saskatchewan were federated. With the completion of the Confederation of the Dominion, the Provinces entered upon the straight path towards nationality. Storms and struggles were to come and overshadow at times the seeming greatness of the Canadian future; but nothing seemed to blot out or really blur the impression stamped on the canvas of fate when the Queen's Proclamation was published on July 1st, 1867, and the birth of the new Dominion was formally announced. From henceforward the record is that of an unceasing expansion along the lines of educational, religious, social and political.

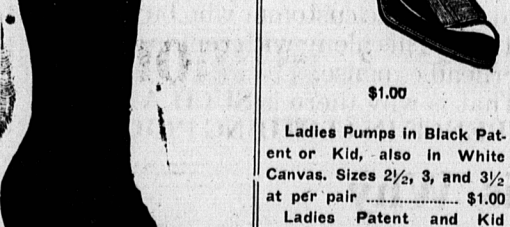
