### Solidly Behind P. C. Hospital Completion Fund

Dr. J. C. Simpson of Summerside was elected chairman Thursday night by the members of a newly organized Doctors' Advisory Committee of the Prince County Hospital Completion Fund, it was announced yesterday by Mr. William Hayward, general chairman.

The seven Doctors comprising the committee were appointed several days ago at a meeting of the entire medical staff of the hospital. In addition to Dr. Simpson, the members are: Dr. R. W. Auld of Kensington, Dr. L. G. Dewar of O'Leary, Dr. Raymond Reid of Wellington, and Drs. J. Austin Delaney, J. B. Downing and A. R. Grant of Summerside.

Asked for an official statement by his committee, Dr. Simpson said "the medical staff of the hospital unanimously supports the basic program of the Prince County Hospital Completion Fund, and you can count on the staff endorsing it in every way."

#### Purpose Of Fund

"We recognize," he continued, "that perhaps some people may think that the recent opening of our fine new building on the hill is all that is required. This, however, is not the case. To assure adequate facilities for modern diagnosis, treatment and care, a final step should be taken to complete the job - by providing for badly needed equipment for the hospital, and constructing and equipping a nurses' training school and nurses' residence. This will properly balance and integrate all services."

The Doctors' Advisory Committee also met jointly, Thursday night, with the Central Committee of the Completion Fund, with the general chairman presiding.

Mr. Hayward commented after the meeting that he felt that their first combined session gave fine evidence of "joint thinking, joint determination and joint action." He added, "as a public representative of the impending \$250,000 campaign, I was most favorably impressed with the way the hospital's professional and lay committees work together."

Mr. Donald Baker, chairman of the hospital's building committee, reported progress made in the development of architectural plans for the new nurses' training school and nurses' residence.

Mr. Austin Scales, chairman of the Central Committee, expressed at the end of the meeting the appreciation of the trustees for the advice and help given by the Doctors. The two committees will continue their joint conferences at a meeting scheduled for next Monday, April 28, at 7 o'clock at the hospital.
