HOW THE BATTLE WAS WON.

The Times Points Out the Lesson of the Yalu River Engagement. The London Times, in the course of a long article on the Japanese victory at Yalu river, says: "In type, the vessels of the opposing squadrons differed considerably."

Such being the variety of the ships engaged, important lessons are sure to be forthcoming from the first great modern naval battle. Many theories fondly beloved and eagerly proclaimed will have to be abandoned, and we shall doubtless fall back upon the old and well tested principles of naval war.

On the actual battle, it is tolerably certain that the story of the deflection by Chinese fire is wholly mythical. Allowance must be made for the probable defects in the Chinese gunnery practice; but their seamen at least fought like heroes, and greater endurance than was shown on either side can hardly be expected.

Of tactics on either side it is, perhaps, too soon to speak. The Japanese are stated to have advanced in two divisions line abreast, and to have subsequently formed line abreast, holding back their weaker vessels in second line.
