Greatest disappointment of the campaign was the inability to get The Donor Prize due to

the fact that the sponsors requested horses which were not available.

On the bright side was the fact that a large number of young horses raced exceedingly well and many of them are sporting new race tabs today.

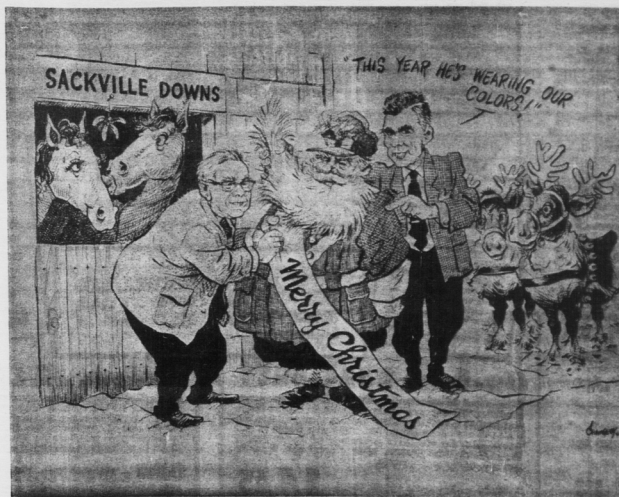
