

Household Hints.

Employ nothing to polish ebouised furniture but an old silk handkerchief.

Use bath-brick and oil to clean brass. But no acid; finish with whiting and a leather to give it a good polish.

The most inexpensive material for curtains and valances for bedrooms, is the "factory cotton"; it washes and wears to perfection, and when trimmed with turkey-red twill bands, is really very handsome in appearance, and looks better and richer after every washing.

Yorkshire Pudding.—To be eaten with roast beef. Three tablespoonfuls flour, mixed with one pint of milk, three eggs, and a little salt. Pour into a shallow pan, and into oven an hour before dinner, for ten minutes, then put it under the roast beef and leave it till you take up the beef; then pour off the fat and send it to the table.

Baked Butter Pudding.—Beat separately the yolks and whites of three eggs, with a pint of milk and a small piece of butter; add the eggs; bake in a quick oven. Serve with sauce.

To remove smoke stains from ivory, immerse the pieces in benzine, and go over them with a brush.

Limp shades of ground glass should be cleaned with soap or earlsh; these will not injure or discolor them.

Farm and Garden Notes.

POULTRY HOUSES.—Clean your poultry houses now, before the hot weather sets in, and you will do much toward warding off the cholera. Fifty quarters will cause this disease, and lousy fowls will soon succumb to it. Whitewash with kerosene and carbolic acid should be used abundantly.

EARLY CUCUMBERS.—Says the Fruit Recorder: To obtain early cucumbers, and at the same time avoid most of the annoyance of the striped bug, it is a good plan to plant seeds about the first of May in frames, without much bottom heat. Small seds turned over, may be placed close together in the frames, and upon these the seeds may be framed; or small pots may be plunged in each. In three or four weeks these may be transplanted into open ground. Set without disturbing the plants, each piece of soil into hills made three or four feet apart each way. If transplanted in the evening, and one watering given, the plants will not droop. The seeds may be planted in the hills late in May, making the crop somewhat later. Use dry plaster, or an infusion of powdered white hellebore, in water, to destroy the striped bug. For pickles, plant during last two weeks in June.

HOME-MADE FERTILIZER.—The Boston Journal of Chemistry recommends as a cheap and reliable substitute for commercial fertilizers, such as superphosphates, etc., the following combination, viz.:—Take one barrel of pure, raw, finely ground bones and one barrel of the best wood ashes, mix them on a floor, and add gradually three pailfuls of water, mixing thoroughly with the hoe. Use in small quantities in about the same manner as the superphosphates. If the ashes cannot be procured, dissolve twelve pounds of potash in ten gallons of hot water, and with this solution saturate the bone flour thoroughly; a barrel of dry peat or loam, without stone, may be added. The mixture should not be too sticky, neither too moist nor too dry. In applying it avoid direct contact with the seed; for instance, when applied in the hill scatter a little earth over it before dropping the seed. A very early visible effect should not be anticipated, but the good results will manifest themselves as the season advances.

GRAFT TO GRAFT.—Stocks or limbs to be grafted, not over two inches in diameter, should be cut off at the distance of four inches. A fine saw should be used. Incline the saw so that the stump, if perpendicular, will shed the rain. The bark must be uninjured. With a sharp knife smooth off the sawed stump. Take a case knife, which is as good as any, place it across the heart of the stock, and force down with a wooden mallet. We use a very narrow screw-driver for keeping open the split. Shape the scion wedge fashion both ways, keeping the bark intact. We make a shoulder as far up as the scion is shaved; which, though not so strong, however insures growth. The inside of the bark of both scion and stock must meet or cross, in order that the sap of the two may commingle. Set the scion at a slight angle spreading from each other. When the stock is small and only one scion inserted, place a piece of wood on the opposite side of corresponding thickness. If the slit does not close up sufficiently, tie a cotton string to keep it tight upon the graft. Cover with wax every part of the cut wood and slit. In three weeks' time go over the grafts and re-wax it if needed. It is air and rain getting in that destroys. Where the limbs to be grafted is from two to four inches or over, it should be cut say six inches from the tree, and from four to six inches may be inserted.
