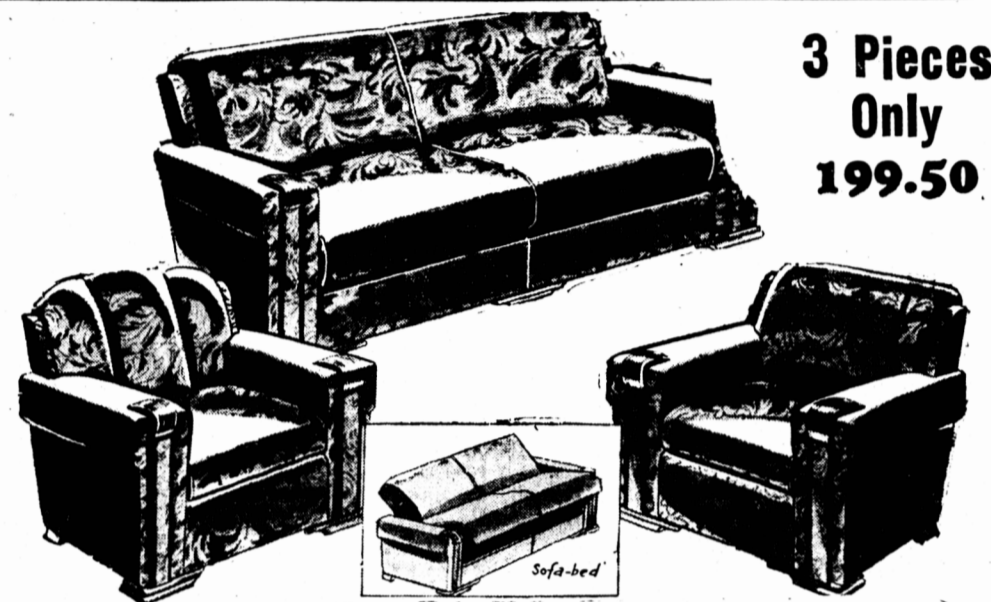

Farm Prices & Market Report

Following are excerpts from the market report of the Provincial Department of Agriculture, prepared this week by Mr. S. C. Wright:

The following are the quotations on feeds: No. 1 feed oats \$2.98; No. 1 feed barley \$2.86 1/2—both in bulk. No. 1 feed oats, bagged, is quoted at \$3.35. Barley meal in second hand jute bags is quoted at \$66.50 per ton. There has been no change lately in the price of wheat nor in the price or availability of proteins. Millfeeds are quoted at \$65.50 in paper bags.

Dairying
Butter prices have remained steady during the past week with the Halifax market at wholesale 68c, and local jobbing 70c f.o.b. Halifax.

Montreal quotes No. 1 solids at 65 1/2c delivered, and Toronto 64 1/2c. New Brunswick is also quoting 68c wholesale, and 70c jobbing. In Charlottetown the wholesale price remains at 68 1/2c, with local jobbing at 70c.

Dairying
Butter production is increasing in this Province. The week ending March 29th the production was 34,393 lbs., and the week ending April 5th it increased to 45,911 pounds. This latter figure is almost 12,000 pounds over the corresponding week of last year.

Cheese prices are apparently slipping and the latest quotation from Montreal for Ontario white and colored is 31c.

Livestock quotations have remained reasonably steady during the past week, and the following are the quotations on the Moncton and Charlottetown markets:
