

### Freight-Rate Assistance Subventions to Be Studied

HALIFAX (CP)—Nova Scotia's first Conservative-controlled legislature in 24 years has wound up its first session after a busy 6½ weeks of post-election business. Lieutenant-Governor Alastair Fraser, in evening dress and top hat, drove to Province House in downtown Halifax Friday night, assented to 120 bills and prorogued the assembly.

Ottawa figured largely in the new legislation, which included a new five-year tax rental agreement and provision for federal power plants, higher old age assistance payments and eventual inauguration of a hospital insurance plan.

**ICED HOT CROSS BUNS**  
Scald 1 1/2 c. milk, 1/2 c. granulated sugar, 2 tps. salt and 5 tps. shortening; stir in 1 c. crisp breakfast-bran cereal and cool to lukewarm. Meanwhile, measure into a large bowl 1/2 c. lukewarm water, 2 tps. granulated sugar; stir until sugar is dissolved. Sprinkle with 2 envelopes Fleischmann's Active Dry Yeast. Let stand 10 minutes. THEN stir well. Add cooled milk mixture and stir in 2 well-beaten eggs. Beat together twice 4 c. once-sifted bread flour, 3 tps. ground cinnamon, 1 tsp. grated nutmeg. Stir about half of this mixture into yeast mixture; beat until smooth. Mix in 1 c. medium raisins and 1/2 c. chopped candied peels. Work in remaining flour mixture. Grease top of dough. Cover and set in warm place, free from draught. Let rise until doubled in bulk. Turn out on lightly-floured board. Loosened until smooth and elastic. Divide into 2 equal portions; cut each portion into 12 equal-size pieces; knead each well apart, on greased cookie sheets and cross each bun with narrow strips of pastry, if desired. Grease tops. Cover and let rise until doubled in bulk. Bake in a hot oven, 425°, 18-20 mins. Glaze hot buns by brushing them lightly with corn syrup. Other treatments: Use confounding icing for cream, or baked berries, or spread cooked buns with white icing and make crosses with chopped nuts.
