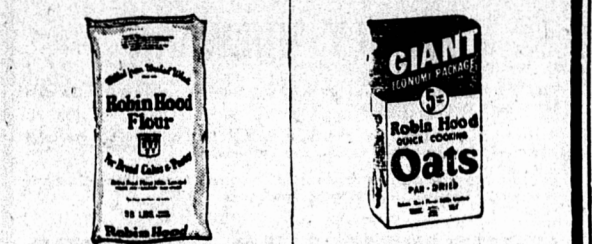

SINCE I LET GOD TAKE OVER By Harry G. Heckmann

Failure never fazed Harry Heckmann. He made an astonishing comeback and promptly gave the credit to God. This is the inspiring story not only of a successful business man but of an equally successful personality. I was brought up in a religious home. Later I became a church member and for years was more or less active in religious affairs. Yet, I never really understood how the power of God applies to my everyday affairs. Like thousands of others, I went my own way and depended solely upon myself. I was reasonably successful and many friends and associates looked upon me as one who was making good in life. Yet I was never satisfied; I was inwardly worried and I longed for happiness and peace. I had created and organized a \$3,000,000-a-year manufacturing business. In 1931, during the depression, this business failed, and I had to make a new start in life. Today I have a prosperous business and a well-equipped farm. I am making what I believe is a success in life. I am happy, in good health, free from debt, free from worry, I have a host of friends, and really enjoy life. I began to think seriously about my personal life and affairs about ten years ago. Believing that there must be a correct way to live and enjoy life, I decided to take my problem to God. I asked Him to show me how I could get the most out of my life.

A New Start

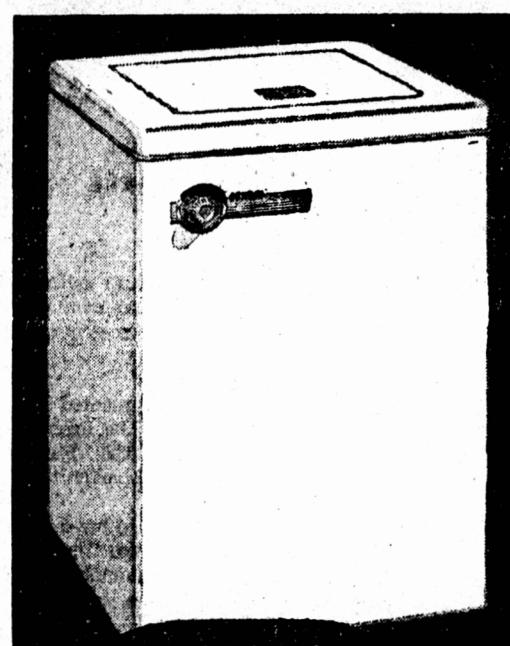
A few days later I received in the mail a religious booklet "I never knew who sent it to me," which seemed to have the answer. It gave me an entirely new slant on life. I began to realize that actually I had never wholly believed in the power of God to help me in my daily problems, difficulties, and worries. I simply lacked sufficient faith or confidence in the thing I professed to believe in. So, with absolute confidence in the result, I decided to let God run my affairs. After some experiences in which wisdom and sound judgment in making decisions were needed, I realized that I must have more poise and better self-control in the presence of other people. My solution was a resolve to look for the good in every person with whom I come in contact. Whenever I meet a person, I say to myself, "I see the good in you and I thank God for this," also, in whatever work I have to do, I look for the good in that. To look for the good in every one I meet and to find good in everything I do requires practice. I had to acquire new habits of thought. When I obtained them, a great change had been made in my life. No longer do I experience petty annoyances when meeting people, and they appear to sense this. I have poise, self-control, and a feeling of relaxation which relieves me of all tensions.

Prays For Customers

My business is to sell two manufacturers' products in Greater New York. In the morning I am usually first to reach my office. I ask God to guide my efforts during the day, and I thank Him in advance for answer to my prayer. Before starting out to interview prospective customers it is my practice to pray by name for each man I do not pray that I may make a sale, for emphasis upon self interest would tend to break the circuit. It would be dictating to God who may not want a sale made on that particular visit, or on any other visit for that matter. I merely pray for my customer as a man, asking that God may

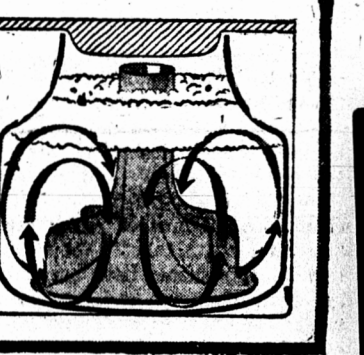

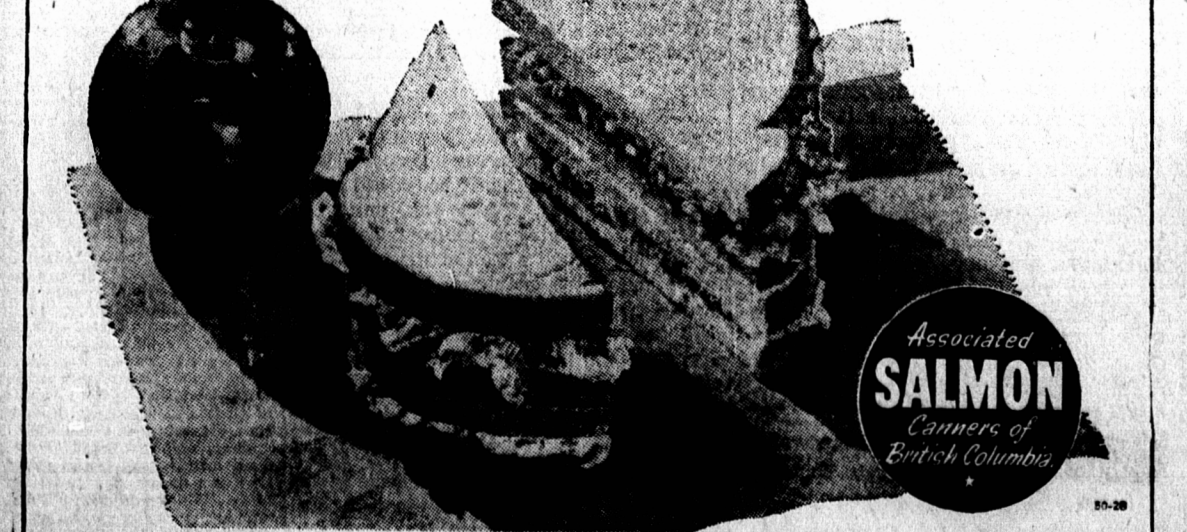
