

OPPOSITION BLASTS PRIME MINISTER

Quiet Returns To Debate In Commons On Pipeline

OTTAWA (CP) — Entering a Commons pipeline debate of relatively unimportant order, John Diefenbaker Tuesday accused Prime Minister St. Laurent of putting the Liberal party above Parliament in the pipeline fight.

He said St. Laurent, with a "supercilious and cynical disregard" for Parliament, has established a state of "executive absolutism" in the government's determination to thrust its natural gas pipeline legislation through the Commons.

But, "finding that he was on a bed of public torture because of his own actions," the prime minister had endeavored Monday, "by a technique so crude as to be transparent, to return out of the kindness of his heart a portion of the rights of Parliament."

Extensive Building Program By Public Works Department

Government Informs Abattoir Company of Loan Conditions

At a recent meeting of the Executive Council provisional agreement was given to the granting of a loan of \$50,000 to the Farmers' Abattoir Company Ltd. of Charlottetown. When established, the company proposes to slaughter livestock and enter the meat packing business in all its phases.

The term of the loan is to be fifteen years or less. The interest charges are to be adjusted to March 31, 1957 and paid on that date and thereafter in quarterly installments. The repayment of the loan is to be made in equal quarterly installments beginning March 31, 1957.

The agreement provides that the \$50,000 block of common stock presently subscribed be paid up and deposited in a chartered bank and that a list of the subscribers with the number of shares purchased by each subscriber be forwarded to the Industrial Establishments Promotion Committee.

HALIFAX (CP) — The tanker Irvingbrook, her hull apparently badly damaged in a Monday morning grounding, discharged part of her petroleum cargo into the tanks of the Irvinglake here Tuesday night before going into drydock.

The 12,500-ton Irving Oil Co. Ltd. vessel grounded on a shoal near the harbor mouth but was pulled free about two hours later by a tug. A harbor official said Tuesday the ship was in "pretty bad shape."

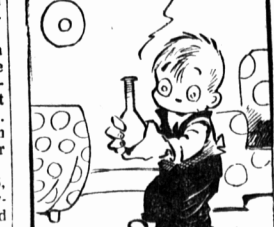
