Sec. 9.—All dirt, sawdust, soil, ashes, cinders, shavings, hair, animal or vegetable refuse, rubbish or filth of any kind, in any house, warehouse, cellar, yard or other place, which the Mayor and Board of Health deems injurious to the health of the City, shall be removed by the owner or occupant of such house or other place as aforesaid, within twenty-four hours, or such other time as the Mayor and Board of Health shall deem reasonable, and after notice in writing to that effect served by the Mayor or Board of Health, or posted on the premises, if he or she shall neglect or refuse to remove the same, then such removal shall be made under the direction of the Mayor and Board of Health, and the expense thereof shall be borne by such owner or occupant, and in addition thereto, shall be subject to a penalty not exceeding Sixty shillings for every such neglect or refusal.

Sec. 10.—If the owner or occupant of any stable or other collection of refuse refuse to allow to the Mayor or Board of Health, or to any person appointed by them, to enter upon the premises, or if the person so appointed, or any person acting under his authority, shall refuse to remove the same, then such removal shall be made under the direction of the Mayor and Board of Health, and the expense thereof shall be borne by such owner or occupant, and in addition thereto, shall be subject to a penalty not exceeding Sixty shillings for every such neglect or refusal.
