## More Islanders Curl

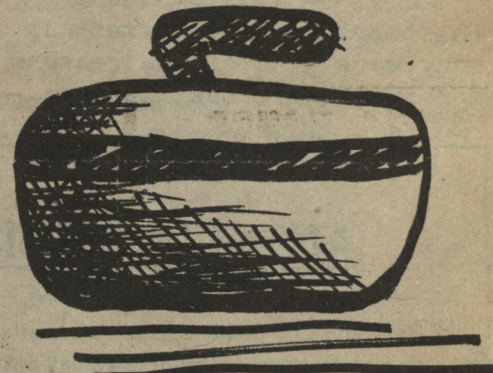
There are more Islanders who curl than there are Islanders who play football. There are more Islanders who Curl than there are Islanders who play hockey.
