Sharp U.K. Disappointment Voiced On Canada's Budget

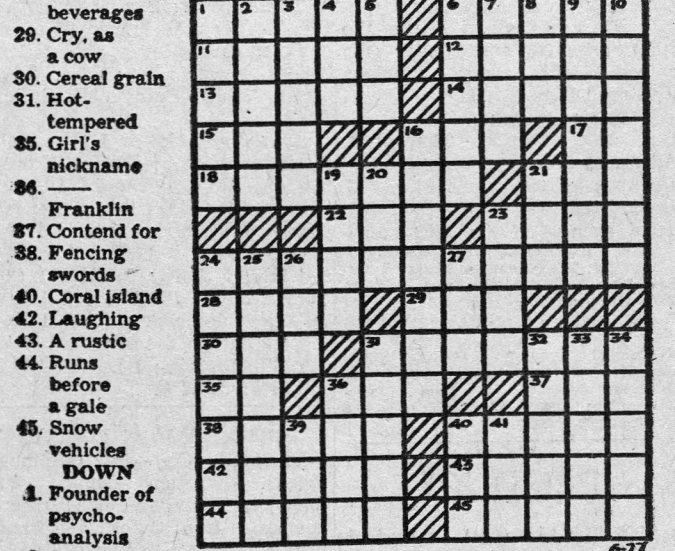

LONDON (Reuters) — The 38-year-old Duke of Devonshire stood unobtrusively in an auction room here Tuesday and watched some of his historic family treasures go under the hammer. Famous paintings, books, silver and even furniture from Chatsworth House in Derbyshire went to the highest bidders to help pay inheritance taxes of £6,000,000. If his father, the 10th duke, had lived only four months longer the peer would not have been compelled to pay taxes on much of the estate.

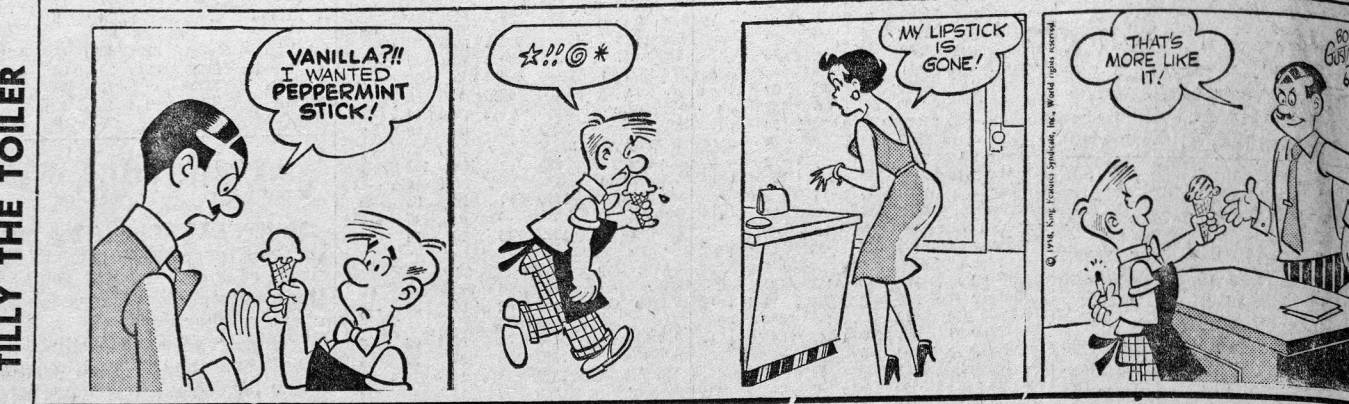
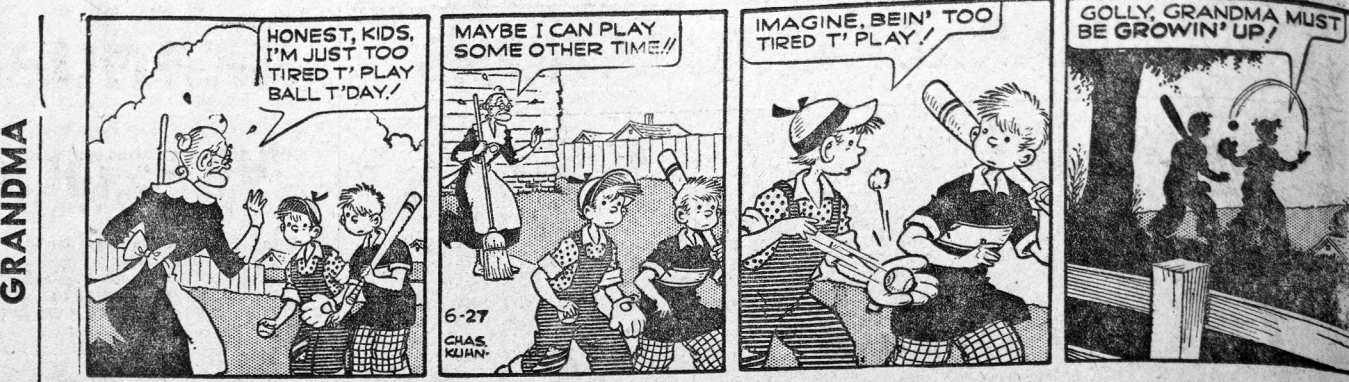

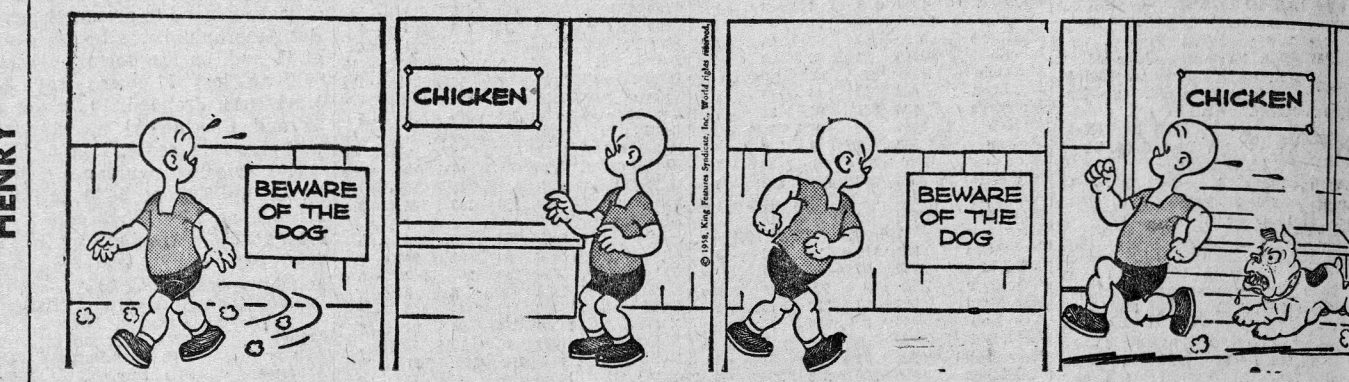
