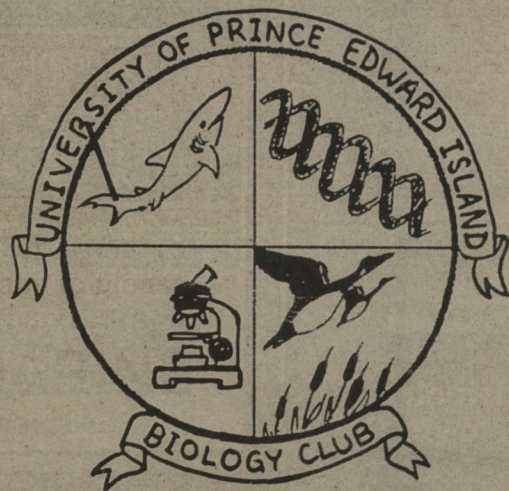
QUESTION: Name two ways to confuse an Engineer?
