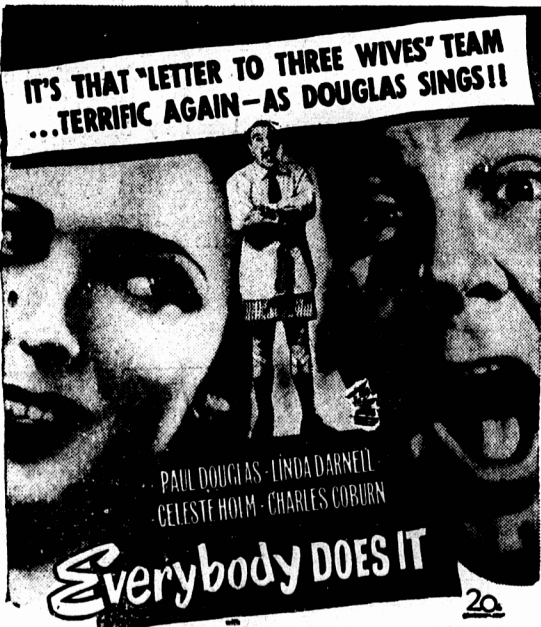

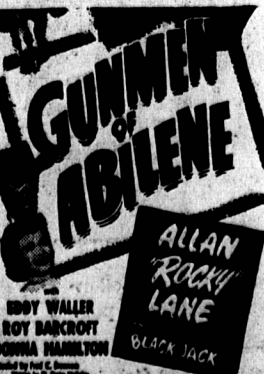

Bristol and Vicinity

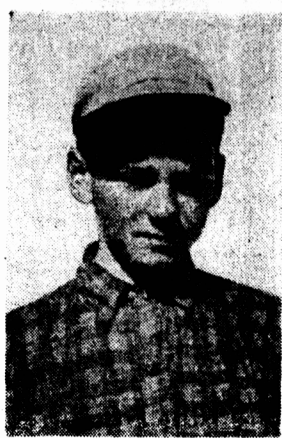
