

Group Flees U.S., Settles In B.C. Woods

ALBERT BAY, B.C. (CP)—A group of 13 adults and children from the United States reported fleeing Communist takeover of their native land, have moved into a remote and rugged section of British Columbia.

The group, equipped with automatic rifles and a mule to carry supplies but with little food or medical supplies — is squatting near a shutdown logging camp at Wakeman Sound, 70 miles from this community 250 miles north of Vancouver.

Communication with the area is limited to radio-telephone twice a day.

However, a bush pilot, who asked his name not be used, said he visited the camp and spoke with the leader of the group, who told him they were from Indiana. One of the group was a welder, another a salesman.

He said the leader told him the group expects the Communists to start their takeover of the United States in about three years.

"They flew a preliminary flight over the area, spotted the camp and thought it was abandoned," the pilot said.

"Apparently that's what decided them on moving in."

RCMP PLAN VISIT
RCMP said its boat will visit Wakeman Sound next weekend to determine whether the settlers are in Canada legally.

Police said they were told the women and children arrived first, landing without food and supplies from a chartered aircraft.

The watchman at the Macmillan, Bloedel and Powell River Ltd., camp fed the group for a few days.

The men arrived later in two 25-foot boats, described as "almost derelicts."

Larry Duke, fisheries department officer who was at Wakeman Sound Saturday, said one boat was a converted lifeboat.

"They apparently have an arsenal with them," he said.

Duke spoke to the leader briefly and was told the group planned to settle about 40 miles inland in rugged bush and mountain country.

"Why anybody would want to move into that country is beyond me," he said.

"The snow is about 10 feet deep in the winter, not to mention the wolves and the grizzlies."

The pilot who visited the camp later said:

"They're not equipped for living in that area. They have children with them and no medical supplies and little equipment."

"They checked 250 pounds of ammunition through customs."

The pilot said the watchman told him the group practices with their automatic weapons.

Portugal Plans Retirement Of White Fleet

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (CP)—Dr. Eduardo Brazao, Portuguese ambassador to Canada, said Tuesday the old sailing ships that make up most of the famous Portuguese white fleet are to be retired.

Dr. Brazao told a press conference the old ships—many of them four-masted and some cross-rigged—are no longer economical and are being outdated by modern trawlers. He did not say when the retirement would start.

He also announced that Portugal will be modernizing and increasing its other trawler fleets in an attempt to cut down imports of salt cod from other countries. He described cod as the main food of the Portuguese people and said 20 to 30 per cent of the needs of the country is purchased from Scandinavian countries.

He said dried cod was not imported from Newfoundland because it was "too small and not cured properly."

He said Newfoundland has a good opportunity to sell dried cod to Portugal if the quality was raised.

Dr. Brazao is here to unveil Wednesday a statue of the 15th century Portuguese navigator Gaspar Corte Real. The statue is a memorial to the Portuguese fishermen who have worked on the Grand Banks and is a gift from Portugal to the Newfoundland people.

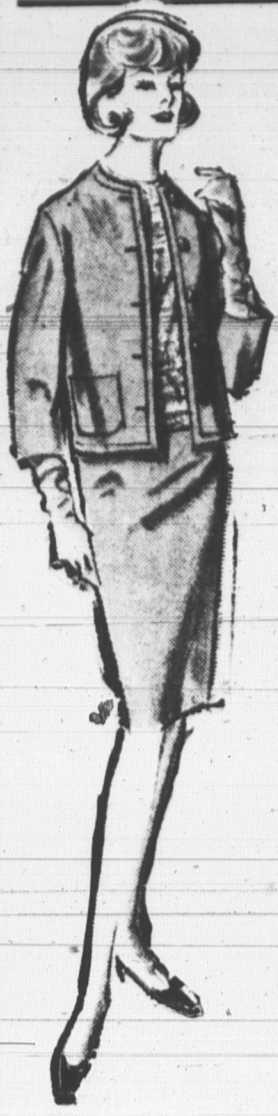

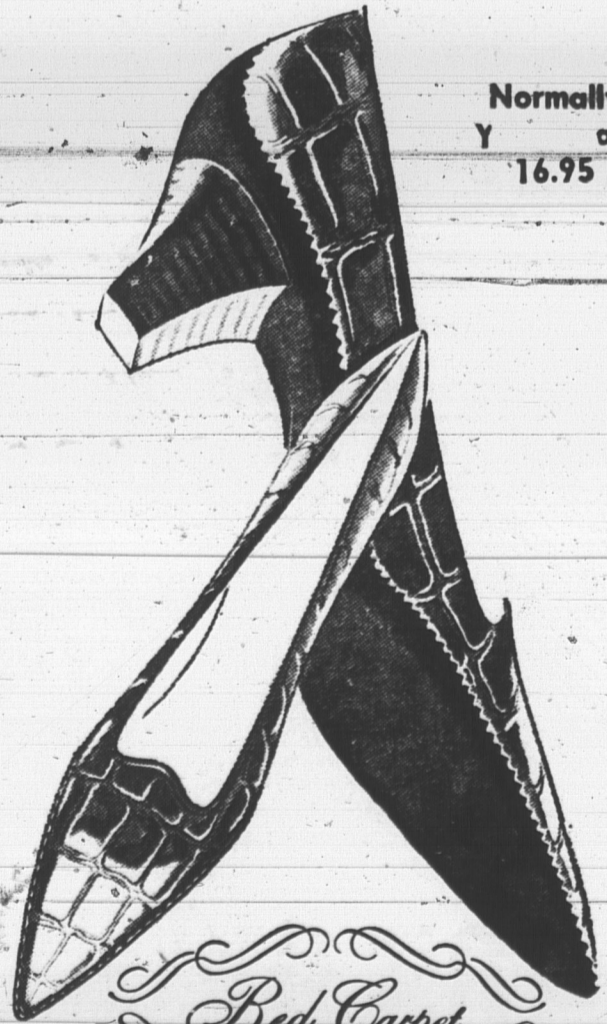

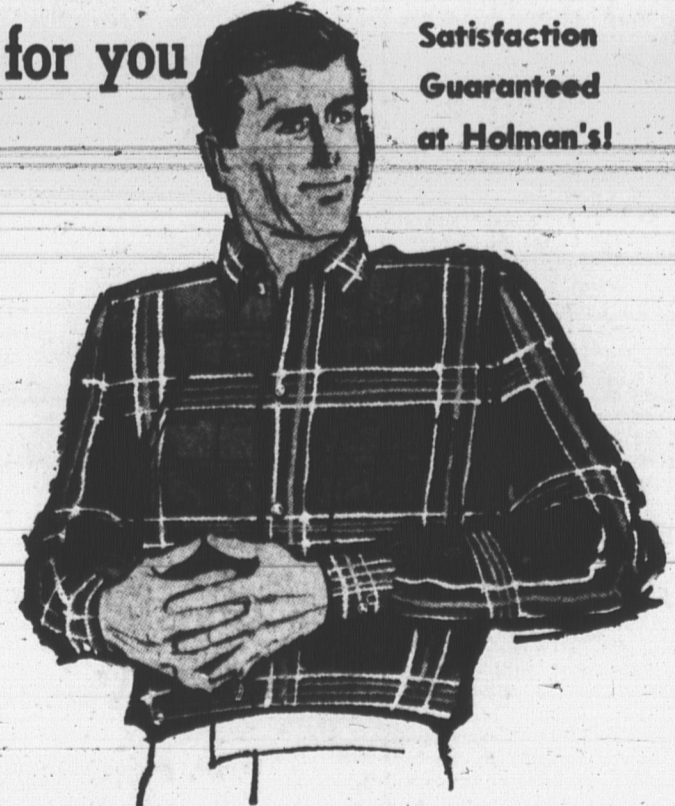
