Local and Other Items

PATRIOTIC FUND.—The Bank of British North America announces the gift of one thousand pounds sterling to the central patriotic fund at Ottawa.

GOING TO PARIS.—Miss Fannie Davidson and her brother John, who gave an exhibition of fancy skating in Charlottetown last winter, leave at an early date for Paris.

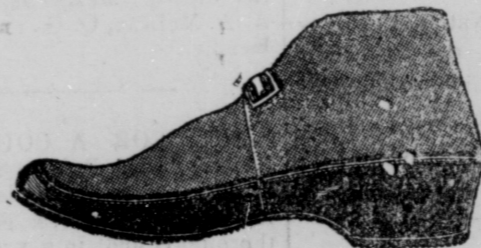

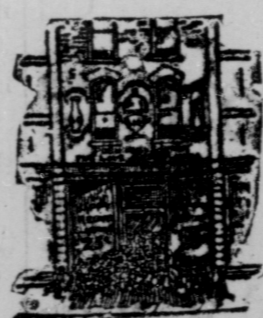
