MARY HAWORTH Nurse Gives Viewpoint On Delivery of Babies

Dear Mary Haworth: There are facts in obstetrics, just as there are in child-rearing, which are not too much emphasized.

Immediately before World War II it was the vogue to use heavy sedation during labor and delivery so that mothers were practically unconscious during childbirth.

Babies were born with electric suction machines and oxygen masks. Sometimes mothers and babies were doped for days. I saw a public health nurse.

Pediatricians worried about brain damage to infants from anaesthesia, breathing and blinding from too much oxygen. Psychiatrists felt mothers and babies were less alive than they were.

Hence their willingness to try natural childbirth, as extra health insurance for the infant, given the guidance and standby support of a sympathetic obstetric specialist, of course. M.H.

Dear Mary Haworth: I've had two children and each labor lasted 20 hours. During the first I had enough anaesthesia so that I wasn't unconscious, but I couldn't focus my eyes on the newborn babe to see if she was all right.

In giving birth to the second child, I had no anaesthesia. The pain was great, but part of the job to my way of thinking. I may say truthfully that this second experience was so full of wonder, delight and exhilaration that my memory of the pain is very, very dim, while the memory of the first is of a time of pain and dread.

I was worn and tired by the first birth. With the second, I had not enough anaesthesia so that I couldn't focus my eyes on the newborn babe to see if she was all right.

Childbirth is a miraculous thing. The pain is insignificant, comparatively, except that persistent pain means we value more than for which we suffer. Best wishes to all who read your story and wish to give birth in the natural childbirth mode of delivery.
