### New York Stocks

NEW YORK (AP) - The stock market continued its post-election boom Tuesday with the fifth advance in six sessions, but the vigor of the rise diminished.

The market established another 25-year high as it did Monday. Better acting divisions included farm implements, coppers, chemicals, most building materials oils and rubbers.

Steels were mixed as were radio-television, airlines and distillers. Motors and utilities were steady. Railroads were lower on balance together with aircrafts. Tobacco was under pressure.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks gained 30 cents at \$140.60, highest since Oct. 17, 1929. The industrial component of the average was up 80 cents at a new high of \$193.40, but railroads fell away 20 cents and utilities were up 10 cents.

Electric Auto Lite was at the head of the most active list up 1/2 at 37 1/2 on 74,517 shares including a special offering by Bach and Co. of 62,426 shares. It was followed by New York Central off 1/4 at 21 1/2, Panhandle Oil up 1/4 at 8 1/4 and Canadian Pacific up 1/4 at 28.

Higher with Canadian Pacific were International Nickel, up 1/4, and Distillers Seagram, up 1/4. On the American stock exchange Lake Shore dropped 1/4 and Royal-ite Oil fell 1/4.

### Montreal Stocks

MONTREAL (CP) - Prices were generally stronger at the close of heavy trading on the stock market Tuesday.

Canada Cement climbed 5 points and International Paper moved up 3 points. Donohue was 2 points higher. St. Lawrence Corporation and Industrial Acceptance were each 1 1/2 stronger. Noranda and Shawinigan each advanced 1 point while International Nickel was 3/4 better. Half-point gains were scored by General Dynamics, Algoma Steel and Powell Ripper, Canadian Vickers and McColl also firmed 1/2 point. Bathurst B. Asbestos and Consolidated Smelters each advanced 1/4. Brazilian, CPR and Bell Telephone improved narrowly.

Aluminum, Imperial Oil and BA Oil were each off 1-2 point. Abitibi was down 3-8 and Gatinco dipped 1-4. Brown Company eased a minor fraction.

Miscellaneous industrials, papers, utilities and senior metals leaned forward while senior oils were narrowly mixed. Beverages, steels, carriers and banks were unchanged to slightly firmer.

A narrowly mixed tone prevailed in the mining section. Frobisher advanced 45 cents and Quebec Nickel was 8 cents stronger. Lorado lost 25 cents while Sullivan and Anacon were each off 10 cents. Western oils were a little easier with Pacific Petroleum down 15 cents and Calvan off 5 cents.
