Butter Prices On Prairies Expected Higher Than East

OTTAWA (CP)—Retail butter prices are certain to be up more on the Prairies than in the rest of Canada because of the new federal dairy policy, authorities here say.

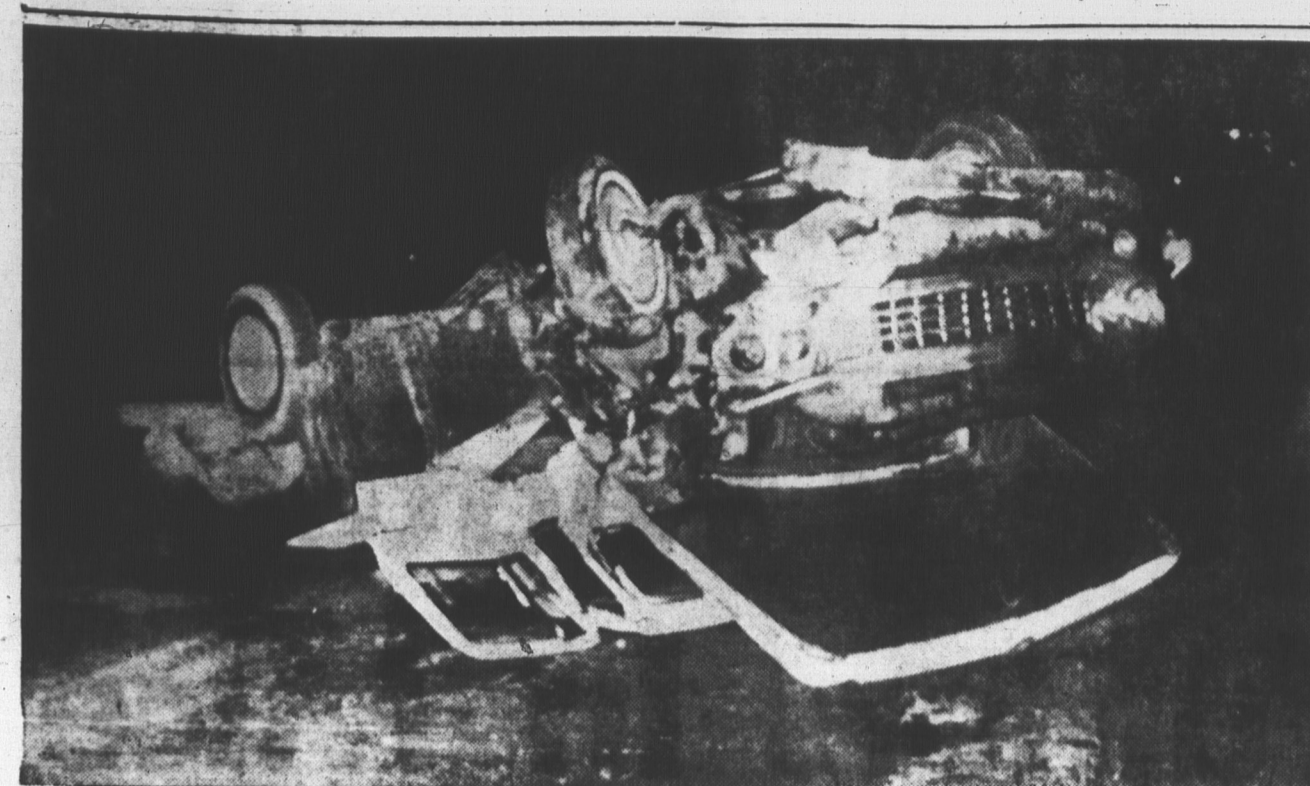
The effect of the policy is to boost the cost of butter to the wholesaler two cents a pound in Ontario, Quebec and the Maritimes compared to 3/4 cents in both Saskatchewan and Alberta and three in Manitoba. In British Columbia it's 2 1/2.

PRAIRIES LOWER

The authorities say before the changeover the selling price of the agricultural stabilization board was 37 cents a pound for all Canada except the three Prairie provinces. It was 36 cents in Manitoba and 35 1/2 cents in Saskatchewan and Alberta.

Wood Ducks Are Imported

The P.E.I. Fish and Game Association and the wild life division of the provincial Department of Fisheries are co-operating by providing nesting boxes to re-establish the beautiful wood duck as a breeding species.

A total of 40 pair of ducks have been imported from Connecticut and boxes have been installed for them in Black Pond, Moore's Wildlife Sanctuary, Spurgeon Jenkins' property at Mt. Albion, the two ponds at the National Park and the P.E.I. Wildlife Park. If this project is reasonably successful the program will be continued next winter.

The wood duck, a species native to the Island, declined with the scarcity of large hardwood forest trees in which to nest and no longer breeds on P.E.I. The nesting boxes, actually just large bird houses, have been used extensively with success in the United States.

Nelson Hurry, president of the P.E.I. Fish and Game Association, requests that any fishermen coming upon the nesting boxes leave them strictly alone as the ducks might well abandon their eggs if disturbed while nesting.

Mr. Hurry said the Association would very much like to see some attempt made to improve winter habitat for upland game birds. He mentioned the multiflora rose, a bush used with great success in some U.S. regions for a cover and a food source in winter.
