Scheduled as last three witnesses in congressional hearings on MacArthur outer are: Patrick J. Hurley, former ambassador to China and outspoken critic of U.S. foreign policy; Air Force Maj. Gen. Emmett O'Donnell, who was quoted on his return from Korea as saying the U.S. could use the atomic bomb there, and Maj.-Gen. David C. Barr, former commander of the U.S. 7th Division in Korea and one-time chief of a U.S. military mission to China. The MacArthur committee hopes to wind up their hearings in a week or ten days, after giving General MacArthur a chance to testify in rebuttal if he so desires.

This is of great importance as when it is foggy it is very difficult to see the bridge and it was very foggy when the accident occurred in the very early hours of the morning.
