Farmers Federation Clarifies Its Position

Seeks Benefits For P.E.I. Indians

OTTAWA, March 24 (Special)— Assurance that the New Federal Department of Citizenship and Immigration would take measures to see that children of Indians were given opportunity to go to school was sought here today by Senator J. P. McIntyre of Mount Stewart, P.E.I. The issue arose when the Senate committee on immigration and labor was discussing parliamentary estimates for 1950-51.

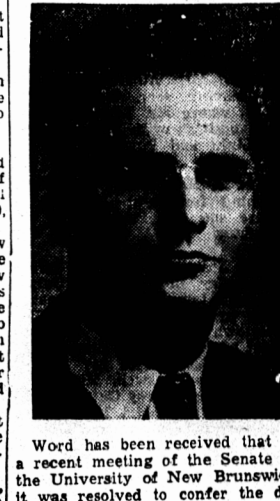
