IN FANCY FASHION

Ripple Scott also closed out the season in fancy fashion with a new mark of 2:11 3, again in 30 degree temperatures and over an off track. It was the 12th win of the season for the pacer, tops in this department of the Downs.

Joe Goguen of Moncton enjoyed one of his finest seasons, getting home first on 48 occasions, to top the list of dash winning drivers. Jackie Bernard of Hunter River, P.E.I. was runner-up with 40.

222 horses appeared in the list of starters this year, an increase of 20 over the preceding year. Of this number, 129 made it to the winner's circle. On 32 occasions, 27 of these horses recorded miles in 2:10 or better. Miramichi Fred was the top 2:10 horse, scoring six miles in this category.

Among the drivers, Harvey Cormier topped the "2:10" list with seven, one up on Joe Goguen.

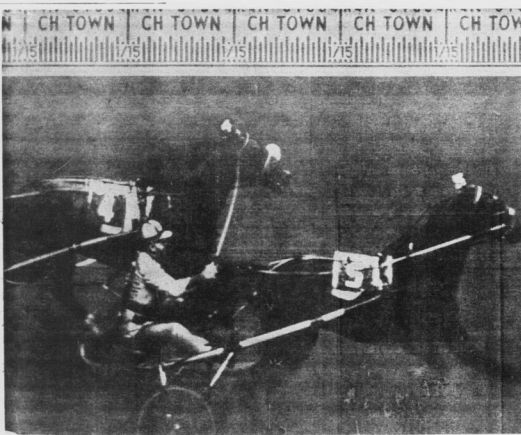

Truro reports success; best season in history

The 10th season of night racing at Truro Raceway saw a great increase in all departments in 1964.

In all 43 meets were held, eight more than were scheduled the previous campaign. Purse paid out amounted to \$75,875, an increase of \$8,000 over 1963. The four-month handle was \$641,302 as compared to \$450,000 a year before.

Horsemen were given a big saving during the 64 seasons when the track management did away with deductions from merry winners.

Major improvements included the widening of the track, a new fence around the first turn, installation of a new electric tele board and the building of cement block stables. Interest became so great during August that a third night of racing was instituted during the week. The additional evening was Thursday.

BIG EVENTS

Of course the biggest event of the entire show was the lowering of the track record to 2:05 by Don MacKenzie's Bob Break. This came about on June 20 when Bob clashed with that great speedster, Willie's Adios, in a circuit free-for-all. Willie took the first trip in 2:07 3 but Bob steamed back in the record-smashing performance in the last trip.

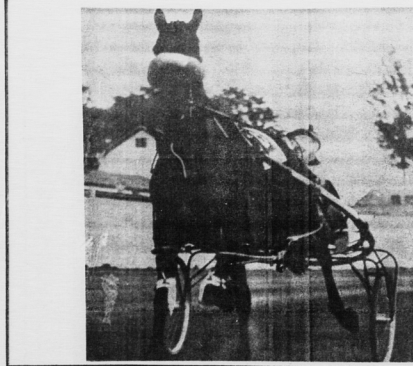
