Revolt in Turkey Said to Flop

ISTANBUL (AP) — Turkish dissidents led by a one-paradised revolutionary former colonel attempted a coup d'etat in Turkey today.

Government troops quickly crushed the plotters in Istanbul and claimed insurrection leaders were overthrown in the college at Ankara, the Turkish capital.

Talat Aydemir, 50-year-old rebel leader making his second bid for power, was reported among those held up in Ankara's War College of Cadets after army troops overthrew the insurgents from Radio Ankara.

These reports said loyalist troops surrounded the war college and air force jet planes buzzed the besieged insurgents.
