## Federated W.I.'s. Have Accomplished Much In '59

Mrs. Ann Wilson (Mrs. George Wilson) F.W.I.C. Public Relations Officer submits the following news of the Federated Women's Institutes of Canada. It will appear in two parts.

1959 has been a gratifying year for the Federated Women's Institutes of Canada, as this review will show.

The first national convention gave this 95,000 member organization a sense of unity—a realization of the varied interests of its members.

In early May, the F.W.I.C. past president and area vice-president of the Associated Country Women of the World, Nancy Adams of Ethelton, Sask., received an honorary doctorate of laws from the University of Saskatchewan in recognition of her contribution to the betterment of rural life provincially. Dr. Adams delivered the convocation address—the first woman accorded this privilege.

In May also, F.W.I.C. was presented with one of five citizenship awards for outstanding contribution in the field of citizenship within the last ten years by the Citizenship Council. Mrs. Jas. Haggerty, Napanee, Ont., provincial president and a member of the sub-executive, accepted this award in Ottawa on behalf of this group.

In July, Mrs. Keith Rand, Port Williams, N.S., president of F.W.I.C., received the first provincial life membership from the Women's Institutes of Nova Scotia.

On July 31, greetings were presented to H.R.H. the Princess Margaret at Stratford, Ont., when she visited the Shakespeare Theatre. Mrs. George Wilson, St. Marys, Ont., public relations officer, accepted this responsibility.

Oct. 1 saw a dream come true, the opening of the national office at 34 Central Chambers, 45 Elgin St., Ottawa. Mrs. H.G. Taylor, former Q.W.I. secretary at Macdonald College, was appointed National Secretary.

In November, from the Ceylon Lanka Mahila Samiti (Women's Institutes) came the word that Dr. Mary Rutnam, formerly of Clinton, Ont., had received the Ramon Magnassay Award, the Nobel Prize of Asia, "for exemplifying the highest type of democratic leadership". As a medical missionary in Ceylon, Dr. Putnam came in contact with the rural women. To bring about a fuller and more beautiful life for them she established Women's Institutes there.

In December, the F.W.I.C. was one of five National organizations which sponsored regional and
