

Emile Griffith Decisions Riguez To Regain Title

NEW YORK (AP) — Emile Griffith won a split decision over defender Luis Rodriguez Saturday night and became the first boxer ever to capture the world welterweight championship three times.

The 34-year-old New Yorker by way of the Virgin Islands regained the title he lost to the 35-year-old Cuban exile on a close but unanimous decision at Los Angeles last March 21.

The 24-1 verdict for the home favorite before a roaring crowd in Madison Square Garden Saturday night was greeted by both cheers and boos.

Referee Jimmy Devlin had to round off the fight in the 12th round for Griffith, Judge Joe Armstrong scored it 103-93 for Rodriguez. The Associated Press score card had Rodriguez ahead 84-81.

The three fights and 60 rounds of boxing, the gap be-

tween the two men is narrow. Griffith won a split decision in title fights in New York Dec. 17, 1950, before either was champion, and Rodriguez evened the score by taking the title in Los Angeles.

Griffith's victory ended Rodriguez' streak at 12. His record is 36-3. Griffith's record is 36-4.

There was a knockdown of anything close to one in the first three fights and the boxer used eight-ounce gloves in-

stead of the six-ouncers previously worn in title fights in New York.

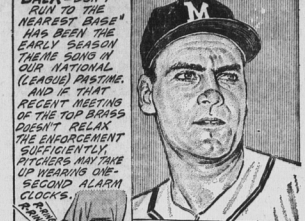
Griffith's determined effort in the last round although it was not as effective as it may have looked from a distance, proved the difference in the fight.

Both Rossi and Devlin gave Emile the lead round although Armstrong awarded it to Rodriguez.

In the last round, Griffith stormed out of his corner, landed a hard right to the jaw and followed with a left hook to the head. Emile worked his hand on Luis' body but the defender flurried back with body punches.

Both men weighed 146½ for the bout that was on network television.

Chateaugay Romps Home Winner in Belmont Stakes

NEW YORK (CP)—Chateaugay shot sharply to the forefront among the top three-year-olds in the United States by romping to a 2 1/2-length victory in the 56th Belmont Stakes at Aqueduct Saturday.

Chateaugay, owned by Pittsburgh Pirates president John Galbreath, won \$10,700 and delighted most of the 33,201 customers by trimming his time a "wonder horse."
