City Druggist Dies Suddenly

Leo M. Doucette, 56 Greenfield Avenue, died yesterday after an extended illness at his home which lasted for several months. Mr. Doucette was a pharmacist.

In partnership with Roy Smallman, he had operated Reddin's Drug Store on Richmond St. since the death of former owner George Reddin with whom Mr. Doucette had studied pharmacy in his youth. In the middle 1920's he had moved to Rumford Maine, to practise pharmacy, but returned to this province on the death of Mr. Reddin.

The late Mr. Doucette was a veteran of the First World War and a past president of the G.V.C. Club which flourished in this city for many years. He has also been a member of the old League of the Cross and was a Fourth Degree Knight of Columbus. His first wife, the former Belle Parkman, predeceased him several years ago.

Survivors include his wife, the former Emma Whelan, two brothers, Frank and Eugene, both of Charlottetown; and two sisters, Helen, Mrs. Gus Peters, Cape Traverse, and Sister Agnes Doucette, of Montreal.
