Freshman Career Planning Program:

The Dept. Of Student Services is setting up a program, primarily for freshmen designed to give students an opportunity to discuss career planning. The program is expected to begin on Jan. 23 with five consecutive sessions, the content being the following:

OVERALL OBJECTIVE: To explore the process of career planning with freshmen students at UPEI

SESSION I: GET AQUAINTED
OBJECTIVE: To become acquainted with the members of the group and leader and to talk about university life in general.

SESSION II: EXPECTATIONS - YOU AND THE UNIVERSITY
OBJECTIVE: To become aware of what the university's expectations are of you and of your expectations of the university.

SESSION III: AWARENESS
OBJECTIVE: To work towards

achieving in each member a sense of the importance of self-awareness through a group game experience.
SESSION IV: TOTAL GROUP
OBJECTIVE: To expose freshmen students to a junior and a senior student and a former graduate now working and explore with them their ideas toward career planning.

This will be done in one large group.

SESSION V: FOCUS ON THE CAREER PLANNING PROCESS
OBJECTIVE: To impress upon students that the responsibilities of career planning ultimately rests on their shoulders and to provide information to assist them in this process.

FORMAT: Groups of nine people, location yet to be settled.

DEADLINE: Students may sign up on Mon., Tue., Wed., Jan. 14, 15, 16. Last day is Wed., Jan. 16.

WHERE: Dept. of Student Services, Main Building.

WHO: Freshmen only. If there are a significant number of upperclassmen interested another program would be held at a later date.

SENIOR'S

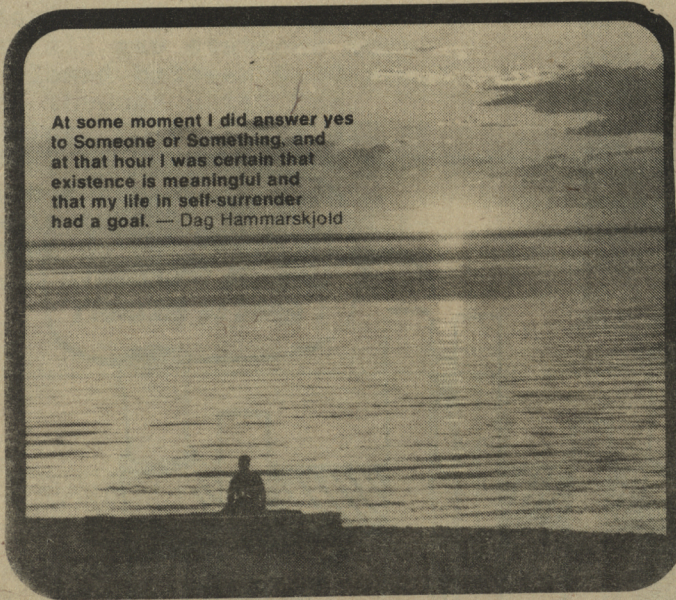
