Business Spotlight

Recent news releases from the fourth Canadian International Trade Fair to be held in Toronto to May 28 - June 8, say:
About 25 countries will exhibit. New exhibitors are expected to in-clude Japan, France and Iraq. Czechoslovakia will be back. A Finnish exhibitor is thinking of show- ing a glider which would be towed over the fair at regular intervals.
British boot and shoe manu- facturers will exhibit for the first time. Holland will show wooden shoes. Newfoundland will send sealskin leather goods. A joint committee of the Society of the Chemical Industry will display the uses of Canadian chemicals in a wide range of industries.

Machinery and plant equipment, textiles and food products are so far the major categories. The Netherlands the highest participants. The British machine-tool section which featured the last fair will be still bigger, with more than 70 com- panies participating.
A group of German firms will show under one name in the hard- ware category. Household fur- nishings and appliances sections are likely to be substantially larger than before, partially due to heavy Dutch participation.

An Italian firm, which last year sold its entire display on the first day to a large department store, will be back with a line of "fine" furniture. An Australian firm which exhibited an "electronic" washing machine, estimates that its return from 120 square feet of space in 1950 will amount to \$8,000,000 over the next three years.

Textile exhibitors will include Austria, Canada, Czechoslovakia, Britain, France The Netherlands and the United States. More than 135 firms, about 70 of them Can- adian, will be there. The Cana- dian Primary Textile Institute has more than doubled its 1950 display.

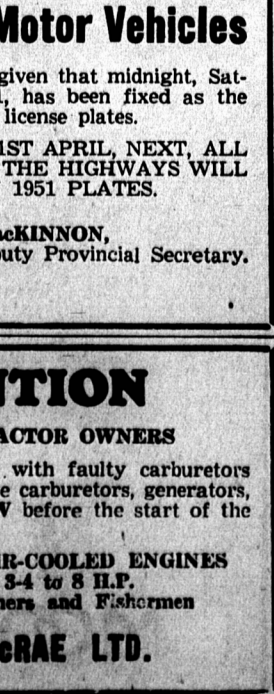
