Montreal Alouettes Hope Rabb Will Solve Problem

MONTREAL (CP) — "I had packed my bag and was quitting football," says Warren Rabb, the promising new quarterback of the Eastern Conference Montreal Alouettes.

Then, he said, along came Alouette coach Jim Trimler. Rabb was recalling the day three weeks ago when he got his unexpected release from Buffalo Bills of the American Football League.

In two years with Buffalo, the 25-year-old Rabb had appeared in 10 games. The team won eight, tied one and lost one.

"I was so upset and despondent that I started packing my bags for home. Believe me, I was through with football for good. I figured if I couldn't make it with Buffalo, what was the use of going anywhere else?"

Then a phone call came from Montreal. A guy by the name of Rabb, the Alouettes manager, if I would like to play in Canada.

"I didn't want to play, and I told him so," Rabb said, but Trimler was persistent. "I figured he talked me into it. I wasn't too happy in any event and I figured I could come up here, make a few dollars, and that would be it."

SAW FIRST ACTION
