

King's M. P. Makes Strong Plea For National Unity

OTTAWA, (Special)—A conservative MP from Prince Edward Island has appealed to members of parliament to foster and develop "a deeper and stronger spirit of national unity."

John A. Macdonald (Pc. Kings), in a commons speech in French and English during consideration of fisheries estimates, said there now prevailed in Canada a feeling of unity "even stronger than that inspired by my great namesake, Sir John A. Macdonald."

The Island potato dealer and farmer, son of a former Conservative cabinet minister and Senator, was warmly applauded for his use of Canada's two official languages.

Sir John A. Macdonald had emphasized the importance of national unity at the time when the principles of unity were so necessary "to the merging of two great peoples into one and the same nation." They were originally laid them and firmly established, he said, but they have just as much meaning today.

HAPPY BALANCE
While he felt there would always be "on both sides, extremists" and "all-out nationalists," the happy balance will always be struck by the many who are tolerant, realistic, fair and generous in their relationships with individuals regardless of race, religion, color and other factors.

"I am by no means alone in deriving pleasure from the fact that whereas the first group is dwindling, the second is expanding very noticeably," he added.

Canada owed much to the French-speaking fellow pioneers. It had been the Maritime Acadians who had helped pioneer the

east-coast fishing industry. While the industry had progressed over the years, there was much more which should be done to improve it, he said during Commons consideration of the Department of Fisheries estimates.

URGES LOBSTER HATCHERY
He recommended establishment of a lobster hatchery in Prince Edward Island, similar to those operated for salmon and trout; continued experimentation in the search for a better lobster trap, and federal assistance in building up of a larger dragger fleet in the Souris area.

Fishermen in some parts of Prince Edward Island "are becoming more and more interested in trap limitation" as a conservation measure, he told the House.

Some areas had expressed the

wish that such a program be instituted, and Mr. Macdonald asked that government give assistance and guidance to any group which voluntarily decided to limit the number of traps to be set in a given area.

OIL IN YEMEN?
CAIRO (Reuters)—Oil deposits have been found in Yemen, six miles from the Red Sea coast, the newspaper Al Gomhouria reported. The Yemeni government has sent experts to conduct tests.
