Neglect Of Animal Charge Dismissed By Magistrate

A charge of neglect of an animal being conveyed, was yesterday dismissed against Abe Freeman, Fredericton, by Magistrate A.J. Haslam in city police court.

He felt that there was a possibility that the animal may have been injured during hunting operations, and recommended that a responsible person should be present when such movements were going on.

The Magistrate also felt that in a case such as this possibly a maximum of 18 animals be loaded in a car. He commended the actions of Vernon J. Dennis, inspector and special constable for the SPCA and also president of the society, Stanford Biggar.

The case arose out of a shipment of horses in which one of the animals had to be later destroyed due to injuries resulting from an allegedly overcrowded stock car.

William James Marshall, Brackley, was fined \$50 and costs or 30 days for driving a motor vehicle while his license was cancelled.

Henry C. MacDonald, Parkdale, charged with assault was fined \$10 and costs or five days. The accused was counselled by John P. Nicholson.

Peter C. Ryan, city, and Blair Ferguson, Bonshaw, charged with speeding were fined \$10 and costs or five days, and \$20 and costs or five days, respectively.

An accused charged with failing to stop at a stop sign was fined \$5 and costs or two days.
