FRANCE TO HONOR CANADA

OTTAWA, May 22.—Premier Poincare of France has intimated to the government the desire of the French republic to contribute a consignment of Lorraine stone to be used in the construction of the memorial chamber in the parliamentary buildings. In accepting the offer, Hon. W. L. Mackenzie King, prime minister, wrote that the gift, in addition to its practical usefulness, "will serve as a perpetual memorial of those Canadians, sleeping in the soil of France, who gave their lives in defence of those principles of ordered liberty and justice upon whose vindication the future of the nations depends."

BARBERS ON ARSON CHARGE

LIVERPOOL, N. S., May 22.—At the trial of Bernard Comeau barber and Ambrose LeBlanc, assistant on a charge of arson here today Charlie Wong, Chinese laundryman, testified that Comeau had told him he expected have a fire in his barber shop as business was bad. Fire Chief Wright testified that after the fire had destroyed the barber shop he examined the ruins but found no scissors or razors.
Miss Laura Brooks who lived over the barber shop told of being aroused after midnight, seeing flame leaping past the window and making her escape in dishabille.

Embargo Fight Grows Hotter And Menacing

LONDON, May 18.—Lloyd George's position on the removal of the embargo on Canadian cattle is the subject of much speculation. North Wales is solidly for the maintenance of the embargo, so perhaps the Prime Minister may be found, when the vote is taken, on the same side as Austen Chamberlain, who would maintain it. Privately, however, Lloyd George is known to be against the embargo. Another member who finds himself in a curious position is Sir Malcolm Smith, who sits for Orkney and Shetland. Orkney is against the embargo, while Shetland is in favor of it. The removal of the embargo is being made an issue in two by-elections. One is in London, where both candidates for the seat vacated by the Earl of Halifax have declared for removal. The other is in Perth, where the Independent Liberal candidate is taking a similar stand. Most of the opposition to removal will come from the Unionist members, but there are also some Coalition Liberals against it. The Labor party will meet next Wednesday to organize support for removal of the embargo. There is considerable speculation in regard to the outcome of the threat made to the Government by Lord Beaverbrook's Daily Express last week. It is understood that removal of the embargo was made the price of the Express's support of the Coalition. If removal does not materialize, the Express will no doubt join the Morning Post and the Northcliffe press in their chorus of condemnation of the Coalition Government.

TO QUELL CHICAGO CRIME

CHICAGO, May 22.—One thousand additional policemen, ten more prosecutors, and four new criminal court judges have been promised to help Chicago rid itself of the terrorists' bombers. The Criminal Court Committee granted a request to a committee of citizens that four additional judges be assigned to that branch. The County Commissioners promised ten additional State Attorneys.
