The Manitoba School Question.

(From the Collegium.)

PROBABLY the most momentous question that has confronted the Canadian people since Confederation is that of the Manitoba School Question. It has grown to such proportions that it now involves principally the maintenance of the Constitution, the education of a people, and the prevention of the oppression of a minority by an unscrupulous majority.

be amiss to give some attention to these suggestions.

Many who maintain that they are in favor of justice and fair play, argue that a commission should be appointed. Upon what question would that commission adjudicate? Would it be their function to determine whether or not the finding of the highest court in the land is right? It would verily be a ludicrous exhibition, a political commission examining the findings of the courts—ascertaining as to whether or not the Legislature had properly construed the law, had sufficiently weighed the arguments, had ascertained the facts of the case before deigning to render judgment? Similar to the litigant who having lost his case before the courts of justice—judgment having been rendered against him in every court of appeal—blatantly suggested to his adversary that the matter be determined by three farmers whose duty it would be to "look into" the decisions of the courts, and correct and improve where necessary.

Another objection is raised to interference at the present juncture as being too hasty. It is pleaded that time should be given to the Government, and that they should be allowed to approach in a friendly conciliatory spirit. Considering that the minority have been persistently pleading for redress, for five long years, that petitions from every nook and corner of the Dominion have been forwarded to the Government praying for interference, that the Government has not as yet been investigating the facts, but that they have done everything possible to oppose it, that an order-in-council passed at Ottawa on July 26th, 1894, was forwarded to Manitoba, appealing to the Government there to take upon itself the task of settling the question; considering too that the said memorial was couched in the most befitting language—fair, just, friendly and conciliatory; considering all these, it is absurd to advocate further delay.

Some may maintain that the facts of this case should be ascertained. Beyond the shadow of a doubt, the facts should have been known before a remedial order was issued. But pray, did not the courts consider the facts as well as the law?

The facts were obtained on the sworn testimony of the many witnesses in the Province affecting education, and the facts relating to the state of Educational affairs, from 1870 down to 1890, were fully disclosed by statements made on oath at these trials. James Fisher, M. P., of Manitoba, a life-long Liberal both in local and Dominion politics, was forced to admit this. He says: "I am sure that everyone who reads these affidavits will admit that the position of the Province affecting education, and that every feature of the position that could affect or be affected by the granting of relief to the minority, or by the operation of the law of 1890, was most fully shown. Every consideration that could be suggested against the granting of relief because of interference with the rights of the majority was carefully disclosed and dwelt upon in the affidavits filed in behalf of the majority. At least of all the facts embraced in the affidavits, on both cases were practically admitted on both sides to be true. There was no objection on either side to the statements of facts presented to the courts. The questions of fact were fully and exhaustively discussed by the counsel on either side, and dealt with by the courts."

It is more shameful to pretend to believe that full and accurate information had been obtained on a subject that had been in litigation for upwards of five years, and that has been a matter of public discussion for a longer period.

There is then no place for a commission—nothing that a commission could investigate, unless it be assigned the task of ascertaining whether the said schools are Protestant. It must be borne in mind that the Protestants of the schools is not the main question at issue—it is a question of the right of the Catholic minority. However, no one possessing the least knowledge of the state of affairs, doubts that the so-called national schools are a continuation of the former Protestant schools.

The administration and control of education is in the hands of the old Protestant Board, whereas all the Catholics having anything to do with the management of the schools, are dismissed. All Catholic inspectors have been abolished, while those of the Protestant Normal Schools were abolished. Catholic Normal Schools were continued, and the principal of the Protestant Normal School of Winnipeg was retained. The religious exercises and teachings in the new schools, correspond exactly with those in the old Protestant schools. A glance at the programmes of studies, will convince the most sceptical of this fact.
