Ban On 'Costellos' Is Aim

TORONTO, March 26 — (CP)—Premier Frost today defended the Ontario Racing Commission's action in halting night racing and said he would fight any attempt to increase the amount of gambling in Ontario.

Speaking in a Legislature debate on a Government bill to extend the commission's regulative powers, Premier Frost said night racing of harness horses would introduce a new form of gambling aimed at getting the money of working men.

The Premier referred to current hearings of the Kafauver crime committee of the United States Senate and said: "When you read of the Costellos and other racketeers, you realize we must do anything we can to keep them out of here."

He said he had turned down attempts of United States interests to promote night racing and new tracks in Ontario. "Nobody can tell me big money will come from Detroit or New York just because they are interested in the Ontario farmer. They're interested in the tens of millions they can get from gambling."

"To most of Ontario people, morals mean something," he added.

The Premier was replying to H. L. Walters (C.C.F. — Toronto Bracondale) who said that night racing of harness horses would benefit farmers who raised standard-bred horses. Mr. Walters said supporters of harness racing did only one-third as much betting as those who followed the running horses. Racing forms were unable to deal with trotters and pacers, and thus there were no form charts to help outside gamblers.
