SIR,

I find that the Governors of the North American and Australian Colonies have on several occasions omitted to avail themselves of their privilege of recommending periodically a Candidate for a Naval Cadetship, and as my right of nominating lapses unless claimed within the year for which the Cadetships are granted, I have to inform you that all Nominations for the present year will be considered by me to have lapsed unless made within the year; and that future Nominations will be considered as having lapsed unless the name of the Nominee reaches the Secretary of State within the first quarter of the year for which it is made.

I beg to call your attention to the annexed list of Medals to be awarded at the International Exhibition of Fruit and Vegetables, to be held in these Gardens, from the 9th December to the 16th December next, inclusive.

Several questions have been asked, with regard to the manner in which fruits that will not bear a journey, are to be exhibited—in answer, I am desired to say, that such fruits may be preserved in sugar, spirits, vinegar, or in such other manner as in the opinion of the Exhibitor will be most convenient.

Wild Fruits and Vegetables will be admissible as representative collections of the country from which they come. All packages

must be addressed to the care of the Garden Superintendent, Royal Horticultural Society, South Kensington, London.

I am desired especially to request, that intending exhibitors will make known their intention as early as possible to the Assistant Secretary—forwarding full particulars of the object they desire to exhibit.

INTERNATIONAL FRUIT SHOW.

From Saturday, Dec. 9th, to Saturday, Dec. 16th, inclusive.

1.—The Gold Medal of the Society will be awarded to the best collection of Fruit and Vegetables produced in the garden of a Sovereign.

2.—The Gold Medal of the Society for the best collection of Fruit and Vegetables grown by any Botanic or Horticultural Society in any part of the world.

3.—The Gold Medal of the Society for the best and most complete representative collection of Fruit and Vegetables from any of the Colonies.

4.—First Banksian Gold Medal for the best and most complete representative collection from the Presidencies of India.

5.—Certificates will be awarded for separate exhibitions of all Fruits and Vegetables, either fresh or preserved, from all parts of the world.

6.—The first Gold Knightian Medal of the Society to the exhibitor who shall obtain the greatest number of first-class certificates.

7.—The second Gold Knightian Medal to the exhibitor who shall obtain the greatest number of second-class certificates.

8.—The second Gold Banksian Medal to the exhibitor who shall obtain the greatest number of third-class certificates.

9.—The first Gold Banksian Medal to the exhibitor who shall gain the greatest number of marks, counting first, second, and third certificates as three, two, and one, respectively.

IN THE MATTER of an application for execution to me issued against the Lands of JOHN MATHEWSON late of Lot number Thirty-three, in Queen's County, in the said Island, Farmer, deceased, and his right, title and interest therein, under the provisions of the Act of the General Assembly of the said Island, 24th Victoria cap. 5, upon a certain judgment entered of record in the said Court in a cause wherein JAMES PEBBLES was the Plaintiff, and the said John Mathewson, Defendant.

WHEREAS application hath been made to this Court, on the part of the above named James Peebles, stating that the sum of Fifty pounds, with interest thereon, is due to him on and secured by a certain judgment of record at his suit against the said late John Mathewson, now deceased, entered in or about or of Trinity Term, in the twenty-eighth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, on or about the 16th day of September, A. D. 1864, for the sum of One hundred Pounds debt, and three pounds costs of suit, and execution of such judgment hath been moved for and on behalf of the said James Peebles.

It is ordered that unless all or some of the persons interested in the lands formerly belonging to the said John Mathewson, deceased, shall, on the ninth day of January next coming, being the first day of Hilary Term of the Court at Charlottetown, for Queen's County, come forward and show cause why execution should not be issued upon the said judgment, at the suit of the said James Peebles against said lands of the said John Mathewson, deceased, or his former right, title and interest therein, then execution will be issued against such lands, and the tenements and hereditaments of the said John Mathewson, deceased, in pursuance of the Act of the General Assembly of Prince Edward Island, passed in the twenty-fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act in amendment of and addition to the Act relating to judgments entered of record in the Supreme Court of Judicature."
