**Bail Set At \$500 In Assault Case**

Charged with assaulting Stephen Bernard Trainor, by striking him on the face with his fist, James Francis Garland, Hermitage, was remanded without plea until Aug. 27, and bail was set at \$500 by Magistrate James B. Johnston, QC, in Queens County magistrate's court yesterday afternoon.

Convicted of falling to stop at the scene of an accident, Henry Joseph Kelly, Dromore, was given an adjournment until Aug. 21 for sentence. Counsel for the defence is John P. Nicholson.

In dismissing a charge of driving with a licence intoxicated against Augustus Adolphus MacDonald, Winsloe, the magistrate noted that the preponderance of evidence presented by the defence, presented a measure of doubt as to guilt or innocence, and therefore under the law he was required to give the accused the benefit of the doubt.

Defence counsel in this case was Lester P. O'Donnell.

The charge of driving in a manner dangerous to the public, was withdrawn by the crown, against Joseph George P. in a Nesle, Charlottetown, who was represented by Mr. Nicholson.

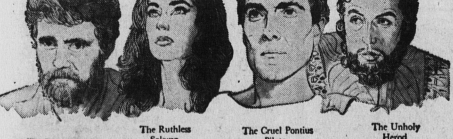
