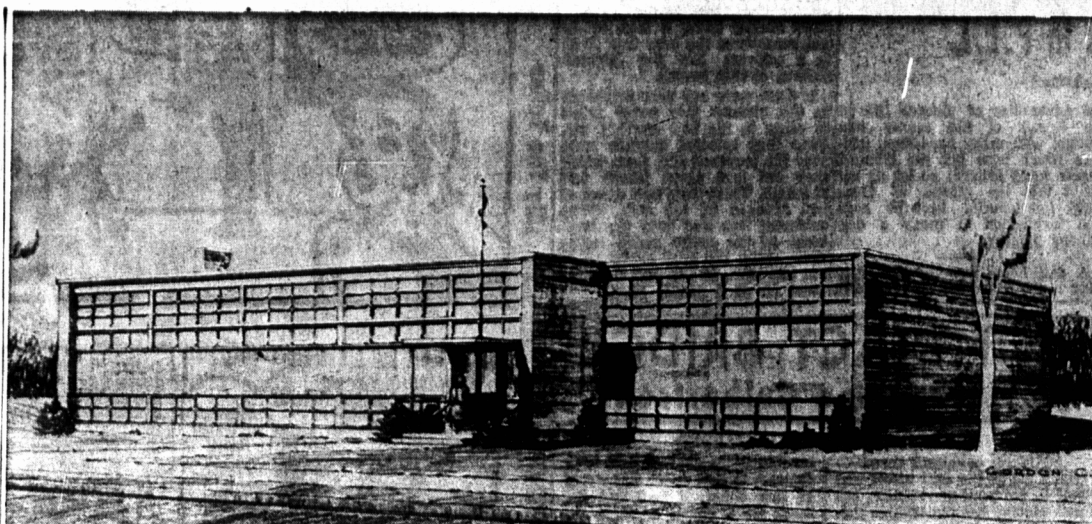


O'Leary
