Mike Soucack Wins Tourney

HOUSTON (AP)—Big Mike Soucack, two down after the first nine holes, rallied with two birdie putts on the back nine Sunday to win \$7,500 top money in the \$50,000 Houston Golf Classic by one stroke over the favored Jack Nicklaus. Nicklaus, who had held or shared the lead through the first 16 holes of the final round, say a 25-foot putt that would have permitted him to tie Soucack's 278-616 under-par, missing the final green cup by six inches.

Soucack, the 1955 classic champion, placed a final round 70, behind earlier rounds of 71, 69 and 68 in winning his first championship since the 1961 Greensboro Open.

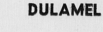
