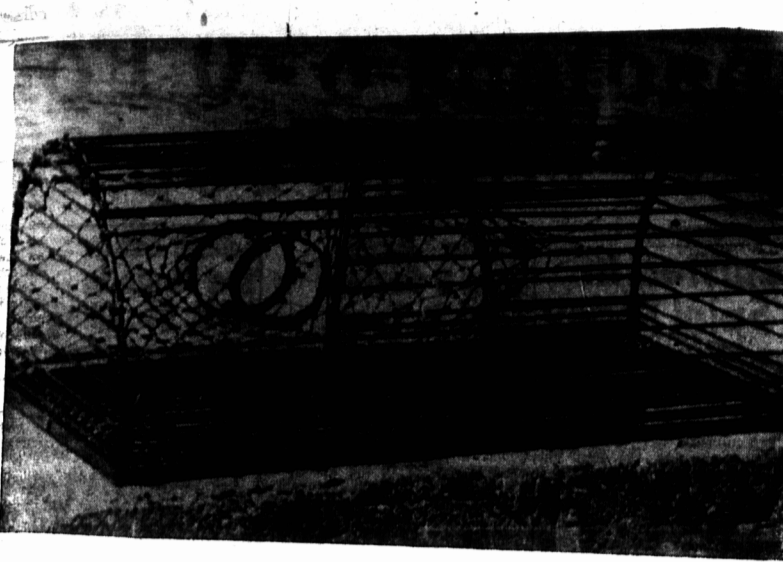
Towed Into Port

OTTAWA (CP)—John Foster Dulles, U. S. state secretary, said on arrival here Thursday he will exchange views with Canadian government leaders on defence of Europe and Asia and on economic problems.
In a brief statement, he referred to Canada as "a Pacific power" and mentioned this country's role on the truce-supervisory commission in Indochina.
"We are interested in many parts of the world in the defence of freedom," he said.

SUPPORTS U.S. REPLY

A foreign office spokesman said the United States had consulted Britain and other nations which fought the Korean war on the UN side before replying.

Boat Building At Georgetown
"A few days ago the writer visited the boat building shop of Mr. Marcellus Gotell in Georgetown, where for the past few years fishing boats have been built for East Coast fishermen by Mr. Gotell. The distinctive quality, lines, workmanship and the stability of these boats have earned for them and their builders the name of "Gotell Craft". The fine lobster fishing boat now under construction is for Mr. Peter Boudreault of Panmure Island and it is the third fishing boat built in this shop for Panmure Island fishermen during the past few years.
When Mr. Gotell builds a boat he turns it over to the owner complete in every respect, engine installed, boat painted and even the tiller ropes in place.
The particular craft now nearing completion is 30 feet, overall length, with a 7 ft. 3 in. beam and is 53 inches in depth. She will draw 22 in. of water aft and 8 in. forward. She is strip planked of seasoned New Brunswick white spruce, measuring 1 1/2 in. by 13/16 in. The keel is of seasoned Prince Edward Island, yellow birch and the washboards of seasoned Island spruce. Elm timbers, 1 1/2 in. by 3/4 in. are placed 7 in. apart, giving the boat exceptional strength and durability. When completed she will be powered by a Chevrolet Engine.
It is encouraging to note that the art of boat building is not lost to Georgetown. The number of first class fishing boats, which have been constructed by Mr. Gotell and which have proven their capability and durability, under all conditions, are a credit to his workmanship and exactness to detail during construction. With their fine record they should assure for their builder continued success and expansion in this industry.

Metal Lobster Traps To Undergo Fishing Tests

The new three bow metal lobster trap undergoing experiments by the Fisheries Research Board under the direction of Dr. Wilder at the Biological Station, St. Andrew's, N. B., will be given an overhauling by local fishermen at the annual meeting of the P. E. Island Fishermen's Association at the Charlottetown hotel tomorrow following the luncheon meeting.
Mr. E. M. Gorman, Director of Fisheries in the Department of Industry and Natural Resources under Hon. Eugene Cullen in describing the experiment trap said it was one of the types used of three bow construction of 3/4 inch iron rods with cover of quarter inch steel rods. It is 36 inches long and 19 1/2 inches wide and 13 1/2 inches high. Out-of-water weight is 35 lbs. in-water it weighs 30 lbs.
