### CANADA EMPLOYMENT

Should you be thinking about part-time, summer or permanent employment, perhaps you should consider registering with the Canada Employment Centre on Campus. Registration is voluntary, but unless you register we have no way of contacting you.

Following is a listing of summer employment opportunities which you might wish to consider:

- A booklet describing Federal Summer Employment Opportunities and application forms are available. It is recommended that a separate application form be completed for each position you are interested in. Positions include Visitor Services Attendant, Sector Supervisor, Student Placement Officer, Park Warden, Park Labourer or Janitor, Beach Captain,

Surfguard or Waterfront Guard, Green Gables Interpretive Guide, Historic Park Guide, Inshore Rescue and Casual Farm Labourer at Research Station.

It should be noted that some of these jobs are **not designated for students only**, even though students may be hired to fill them. Application deadline is **January 31, 1985**.
