NEWS BY TELEGRAPH.

LONDON, Feb. 24.

The Duke of Edinburgh went to Windsor to-day to leave his children with the Queen while he goes to Russia to bring the Duchesses home.

Advices have been received at the Liberian consulate here of the annexation by Liberia, on mutual and peaceful terms, of the important country adjoining the interior frontier of the Republic known as the Kingdom of Medina.

An interview shortly takes place between King Alfonso and the King of Portugal at Monastorebida and Alusia.

VIENNA, Feb. 24.

The debate on the budget has begun in the Hungarian diet. The opposition of all shades will make an attack on the Tizza ministry. They have presented a motion declaring want of confidence in the Government. The Right abstained from voting in the election of M. Lemoigne.

PESTH, Feb. 24.

The House of Magnates rejected the application of the Pesth tribunal for authority to arrest Maythenic on account of a duel between him and Herr Versiay.

OTTAWA, Feb. 23.

Two hundred unemployed working men marched up Parliament Hill to-day at two o'clock, halting in front of the main entrance. A posse of Dominion police guarded the door. A message to the Premier was sent in by a deputation, stating that there were 250 workmen, mostly with families, all out of employment, and asking that some public work be started to give them employment for a few weeks. They waited till four o'clock without receiving an answer, and then sent in a second note.

Sir John then promised to see the leaders to-morrow morning. They then dispersed.

OTTAWA, Feb. 24.

The reports telegraphed to the papers that the Princess was dining out are incorrect. She has not been able to leave her room or sit up, though hopes are expressed that she may do so in a few days.

Emigration from the Ottawa district will be large this year. On the second March one hundred persons with 100 cars of effects, and on fifteenth March eighty persons and as many cars leave by special trains.
