INSTITUTE ACTIVITIES

The work of the Women's Institute Branches in this Province are varied and make a great contribution in the communities where they are active. There are now Women's Institute Branches in all but one hundred rural school districts. The total number of branches in 1953 was 323, with a total membership of approximately 5,500.

The problem of rural communities still occupy most of the branch Institutes. During the past year the branches spent a total of \$19,148.00 on community projects. Many halls are being redecorated and improved, and several Institutes have invested in film projectors. A good hall and

an active Institute can do much to improve the social and cultural life of a community. Schools continue to receive the attention of Institute branches. The amount of \$17,200.00 was spent on school improvement during the past year. Some of this was directed toward the improvement of educational facilities rather than on school buildings. Also, during the past year there was an increased interest in Health and Welfare activities. Generous contributions were made to Provincial Health and Welfare organizations, to local Hospitals and Orphanages. The work of the Dental Clinic was actively supported. Continued on page 11
